PIC-CARE SCHOOL SUPPLEMENTARY FEEDING PROJECT USING FISH PROTEIN CONCENTRATE

To: Bureau Directors
Regional Directors
Schools Superintendents

- 1. Pood assistance from CARE in the form of fish protein concentrate to augment pupils' protein intake will be introduced in the school supplementary feeding project starting December 1, 1981.
- 2. The fish concentrate supplements indigenous foodstuffs; hence, this food assistance is expected to encourage the production of nutritious vegetables in the school and home gardens.
- 3. The Division Working Committee on Health, and Nutrition will be responsible for the selection of the schools allocation of the commodity, supervision and monitoring of reports.
- 4. Inclosed are a list of recipient divisions with the food allocation and the approximate number of beneficiaries, guidelines for the selection of participating schools and beneficiaries and the management of the food assistance and record form for receipt and consumption of the food commodity.
- 5. Immediate dissemination of this Memorandum.is desired.

IMPLEMENTING GUIDELINES ON THE SELECTION OF PARTICIPANTS AND THE MANAGEMENT OF THE FOOD ASSISTANCE

A. Eligibility for Participation

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 - a. All Paglingap schools are participants.
 - b. Priority should be given to small rural schools in economically depressed areas with a large element of cultural minorities.
 - c. The schools should have on-going food production projects and home gardens.

2. Beneficiaries

All pupils in Grades I to IV in the selected schools are beneficiaries.

B. Ration and Frequency of Feeding

- 1. Ration
- a. Each beneficiary will have a ration of 10 grams fish protein concentrate (FPC) per feeding day which provides roughly 39 calories and 7 grams protein.
 - b. In household measure, one (1) cup of FPC weighs 100 grams and makes 10 rations.

 2. Frequency of feeding
 - - a. Snacks/hot lunch supplements using fish protein concentrate will be served three (3) days a week, or a total of 42 feeding days up to the end of the school year in March 1982.
 - b. Food preparations using purely indigenous foodstuffs should be served two (2) days a week or on the days that FPC is not served.
- C. Preparation of FPC into Supplementary Meals
 - 1. Use of local/standardized recipes
 - a. FPC should be prepared into soups, fried or steamed viands and other local recipes, in addition to food grown in the school gardens and/or contributed by parents.

- b. The anclosed standardized recipes may be used when ever feasible or modified using locally available substitutes.
- 2. Food preparation and distribution
 - a. The preparation of supplementary food using FPC should be done in school under the supervision of the food service teacher and/or teachers in-charge of classes.
 - b. The food may be prepared in a common kitchen for all the beneficiaries, or by class or group of classes.
 - c. In any case, mothers and out-of-school girls should assist, by schedule, in the food preparation and distribution.

D. Records and Reports

1. Records

The following records should be kept up-to-date in all participating schools:

- a. Local recipes used; standard recipes used and modifications made; reaction of pupils to the food served
- b. Cash contributions and disbursements
- c. Contributions of foodstuffs from school/home gardens
- d. Receipt and daily consumption of FPC, using the inclosed record form; and
 - c. Schedule of mothers and out-of-school girls to assist in food preparation.

2. Reports

The following reports should be submitted to the School Health and Nutrition Center by the Division Working Committee on Health and Nutrition:

a. A list of participating schools with the number of beneficiaries, number of bags of FPC received and date when feeding started, to be submitted on or before December 15, 1981.

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b. Monthly report of FPC consumed, by school; list of operational problems encountered and solutions/recommendations for solution; reaction of beneficiaries, school personnel and parents to the food assistance.
