NATIONAL WORK COMPERENCE IN NONFORMAL EDUCATION

To: Bureau Directors
Regional Directors
Schools Superintendents

- 1. The Ministry of Education and Culture, Office of Nonformal Education will hold the Second Conference of Public Schools Nonformal Educators at the Don Mariano Marcos University System, Batac, Elocos Norte on January 25-29, 1982.
- 2. The theme of the conference is "The Role of Nonformal Education in the Development of the Barangay", in line with the Kilusang Kabuhayan at Kaunlaran (KKK) movement of the New Republic. The main objective is to upgrade the competencies of nonformal educators along with the Government's barangay development goals. Specifically, it is aimed at:
 - imparting and establishing objectives and strategies of nonformal education in line with the KKK;
 - identifying the common and pressing needs of the barangay which nonformal education and the KKK can help meet;
 - determining the role of nonformal education centers in helping meet the above needs in relation to the KKK;
 - developing strategies that will tap wouldbe leaders and actualize their potentials through involvement in community development;

- e. formulating a prototype action plan that will enable nonformal educators to contribute to the improvement of the barangays in line with the KKK movement.
- 3. The participants shall be the assistant super-intendents in-charge of Nonformal Education in the division, division supervisors of NFE and regional NFE supervisors.
- 4. To make the work conference more fruitful, the participants are requested to bring with them data on literacy, out-of-school youths, unemployed adults, job opportunities, and existing community resources in a selected barangay. These materials will be used in the workshop to attain the above-cited objectives.
- 5. Board and lodging shall be free. All other expenses such as transportation expenses, registration fee of 7100 and daily allowance shall be charged against division local funds, subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations.
- 6. Inclosed are the tentative program of activities and a sample survey form.
- 7. Immediate dissemination of and compliance with the contents of this Memorandum are desired.
