NATIONAL LIVE-IN SEMINAR-WORKSHOP ON WORK-ORIENTED
EDUCATION FOR IN-SCHOOL AND OUT-OF-SCHOOL YOUTH

TO: Bureau Directors
Regional Directors

1. The ASEAN Development Education Project in cooperation with NADEC-Philippines, College of Education, University of the Philippines, and the Ministry of Education and Culture, will conduct a National Live-In Seminar-Workshop on Work-Oriented Education for In-School and Out-of-School Youth on May 18-22, 1982, at the Benitez Memorial Center, Magsaysay Avenue, U.P. Campus, Diliman, Quezon City.
2. The Sub-Project on Work-Oriented Education for In-School and Out-of-School Youth, which is also being conducted in the other ASEAN member countries approaches the problem of unemployed human resources by trying to mobilize and develop existing capabilities in ASEAN countries in order to evolve a model for linking manpower development and manpower utilization.
3. The national seminar-workshop will have for its theme "Maximum Utilization of Farm Resources and Products for Livelihood Generation Through Work-Oriented Education".
4. The general objective of the seminar-workshop is to strengthen the occupational orientation of education, both formal and nonformal, to ensure adequate preparation on the part of the learners to maximize the utilization of farm resources and products for livelihood generation. Specifically, the seminar-workshop aims to:
 - a. formulate a national concept of work-oriented education for in-school and out-of-school youth;
 - b. identify areas/courses in the curricula of elementary, secondary and nonformal education which can serve as focal points in the development of a work-oriented education;

- c. develop the steps and requirements in the formulation and implementation of a work-oriented education in the elementary, secondary and nonformal education; and
- d. recommend strategies and/or programs for the maximum utilization of farm resources and products.

5. Forty participants will be invited to this seminar-workshop. To be invited are:

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6. The names of designated participants should be sent to Dean Paz G. Ramos, Director, NADEC-Philippines, College of Education, University of the Philippines, Diliman, Quezon City, on or before April 15, 1982.

7. In view of the significance of the Sub-Project and to make the seminar-workshop more productive, the participants are requested to bring with them regional/division action-programs on work-oriented curriculum for the maximum utilization of farm resources and products for livelihood generation using the inclosed forms (Inclosure No. 1).

8. After the seminar-workshop, the participants are expected to develop:

- a. a national concept of work-oriented education for in-school and out-of-school youth;
- b. a list of areas/courses in the educational curricula and nonformal education to serve as focal points in the development of work-oriented education;
- c. a list of requirements in the formulation and implementation of work-oriented curriculum; and

- d. a list of strategies and/or programs to implement the workshop theme, "Maximum Utilization of Farm Resources and Products for Livelihood Generation Through Work-Oriented Education".

9. The regional directors are expected to provide financial and personal support to the participants in the conduct of regional echo seminar-workshops where teachers in the school division in the elementary, secondary, nonformal education, as well as the tertiary levels will participate.

10. Board and lodging will be provided to all the participants for the duration of the seminar-workshop by the ASEAN Development Education Project (ADEP).

11. Likewise, traveling expenses from the region and back will be charged against the funds of the ADEP. In case of the official delegates from Regions II, V, VI, VII, VIII, IX, X, XI, and XII, air tickets will be sent to regional directors upon receipt and confirmation of officially designated participants by NADEC-Philippines. However, in the case of delegates from the other regions and government agencies, travel expenses will be reimbursed in Quezon City upon submission of tickets and/or official receipts. In all cases, these transactions will be subjected to the usual accounting and auditing regulations.

12. Participants are expected to check in at the Benitez Memorial Center, Magsaysay Avenue, U.P. Campus, Diliman, Quezon City on May 17, 1992. A map showing the seminar-workshop venue and a copy of the Program of Activities are also inclosed.

13. Immediate dissemination to all concerned and compliance with the contents of this memorandum are earnestly requested.
