THE FFP-FAHP-FFPCC: ITS PROGRAM OF ACTIVITIES FOR THE SCHOOL YEAR 1982-83

To: Bureau Directors
Regional Directors
Chiefs of Services and Heads of Units
Schools Superintendents
Presidents, State Colleges and Universities
Vocational School Superintendents/Administrators

- 1. The suggested program of activities of the FFP, FAHP and FFPCC for the school year 1982-83 is inclosed for the information and implementation of all active FFP-FAHP-FFPCC chapters nationwide. The activities of the members shall be geared to the theme: "Intensified Livelihood Program under the KKK sa Paaralan."
- 2. The suggested year-round activities are planned to set direction for the different school chapters toward the intensified programs/projects aimed at expansion of existing chapter projects that will increase production and income of members.
- 3. It is likewise suggested that chapter week celebrations be held simultaneously during the month of September in conjunction with the celebration of the Education Week, while the regional work conference should be scheduled not later than October 1982. The activities of the organization during the week celebration or regional conference should include, among others, both academic skills in competitive activities and demonstration of agricultural/home technology as well as other related activities.
- Authority is hereby granted for the Regional FFP-FAHP-FFPCC Board of Directors through its chairman to insure that the tentative dates suggested in the inclosure be followed in order that representatives of the FFP-FAHP National Office will be able to participate. In case of change of dates outside of the tentative suggested dates in Inclosure No. 1, the Office of the National Adviser should be informed at least one month before the holding of the regional work-conference to enable the National Office to send its representative.
- 5. All school chapter superintendents, administrators, principals, advisers and other adult leaders of the organization are expected to lead the members toward accomplishing the goals/objectives of the organization.

- 6. The program of work for 1982-83 is found in Inclosure No. 2. The names of the national adult and student officers including the National Board of Directors for this school year are found in Inclosure No. 3.
- 7. It is desired that this Memorandum be given the widest publicity possible.
