16TH NATIONAL BIENNIAL SEMINAR IN HOME ECONOMICS  
AND HOPE AWARDING CEREMONIES

1. The Philippine Home Economics Association (PHEA), in cooperation with the Ministry of Education and Culture, will hold its 16th National Biennial Seminar on August 26-27, 1982 at the Philamlife, Auditorium, United Nations Avenue, Manila. It will be highlighted by a presentation of regional Home economists Outstanding in Philippine Education (HOPE) awardees.

2. The objectives of the seminar which are geared towards the theme "Strengthening Filipino Values Through Home Economics Education" seek to:

- a. Promote the role of the home as a meaningful venue for the development of Filipino values;
- b. Attain a working concept to strengthen personal, family and community values;
- c. Intensify active participation in the government's thrust for economic sufficiency; and
- d. Extend recognition and provide incentive and inspiration to deserving home economics teachers, students/pupils for their valuable contribution to the improvement of family and community life.

3. A tentative program of activities is inclosed. A special feature is the presentation of Home economists Outstanding in Philippine Education (HOPE) awardees of each region. Regional directors and schools superintendents are requested to attend the awarding ceremonies to lend moral support to their awardees.
