1982 TEACHER EDUCATORS ASSEMBLY

To: Deputy Ministers
Bureau Directors/Regional Directors

Deans of Colleges of Education

- 1. The 1982 Teacher Educators Assembly sponsored by the Bureau of Higher Education (BHE), Ministry of Education and Culture and the Philippine Association for Teacher Educators (PAFTE), in collaboration with the Bureau of Elementary Education (BEE) and with the financial assistance from the Fund for Assistance to Private Education (FAPE), will be held on September 28-30, at the Teachers Camp, Baguio City.
- 2. With the theme "Teacher Education in the 80s: Its Response to MEC's Program Thrusts", the Assembly will have the following objectives:
 - a. To re-examine the role of teacher education in the context of national development and plan strategies by which teacher education institutions can be pro-active and anticipatory rather than merely reactive in its approaches to educational problems.
 - b. To explore, define and operationalize the roles and responsibilities of colleges of education in relation to the thrusts of MEC particularly in connection with PRODED and to motivate them to be responsive to this challenge.
 - c. To present and discuss the proposed curriculum for the Bachelor of Elementary Education (B.E.Ed.) in terms of its rationale, objectives, new features, implementation strategies,

instructional materials, specific roles of teacher training institutions, re-training of faculty members, tryout and feedback mechanism and evaluation.

- The following are authorized to attend the Assembly: deputy ministers, bureau directors, regional directors, service chiefs, executive directors, division chiefs in the general and regional offices, presidents of state colleges and universities, heads of private schools, colleges and universities, deans of colleges of education, teacher educators, and representatives of CEAP, ACSC, PACU and other associations.
- 4. A registration fee of \$7300 shall be charged each participant to cover conference expenses including those for board and lodging at Teachers Camp and for handouts. For those who will not avail of board and lodging at Teachers Camp, the registration fee shall be \$7150 only.
- 5. Fees and expenses for transportation, board and lodging, and other items that may be incurred in connection with attendance at the Congress, whether as delegate or as member of the working committees, shall be charged against local funds, subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules. Members of the Secretariat, however, shall charge their travel expenses against BHE funds. Frivate schools and organizations may have their own arrangements regarding the expenses of their own delegates.
- 6. Registration of delegates shall be on Monday, September 27 at 4:00 P.M. at the Teachers Camp. Registration before September 27, however, will be entertained at the Bureau of Higher Education, MEC, Arroceros, Manila.
- 7. Inclosed is the tentative program of activities.
- 8. Immediate dissemination of the contents of this Memorandum to all concerned, particularly the deans of colleges of education, is desired.
