II. Local Action Committee on the school level.

Chairman - Community Leader (Note: Chairmanship should be rotated every year).

Members - Chairman of the various sub-committees named below

PTA Officers of Members, Barangay Officials/Active Members, and civic leaders.

Coordinators: School Authority

III. Sub-Committee:

A. Selection Committee - to select the model pupils, children/ out of school youth.

B. Program - to take charge of convocations and details on the presentation of awards as well as other activities that fall within the province of this committee.

C. Invitation - to take charge of inviting guest speakers, parents, civic and religious association and other community leaders/group to the award program.

D. Reports and scrapbooks - This Committee will compile pictures of the model children, prepare scrapbooks providing a copy each for the school, the Division and the national headquarters

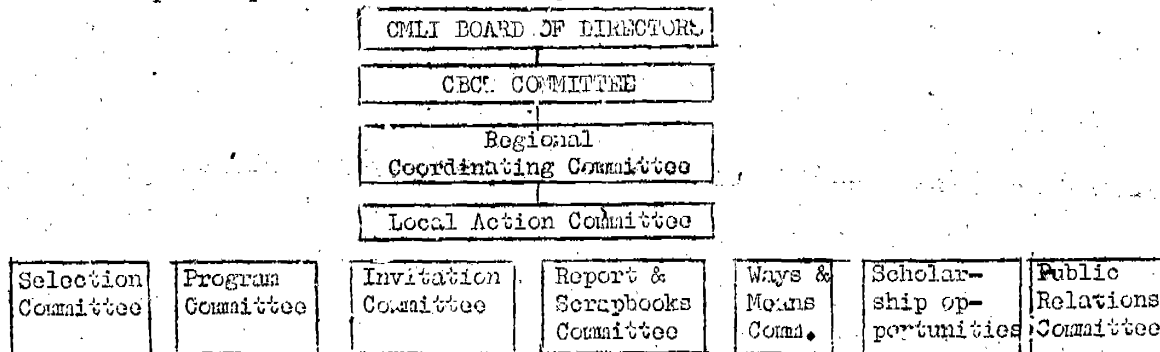
E. Public Relations This Committee will:

1. Publicize model children and this project in local papers.
2. See to the installation at a conspicuous place in school of a "roll of honor" blackboard whereon names of model children shall be written.
3. Coordinate efforts to spread information about this project in the community.

F. Ways & Means (Finance) - This committee will be responsible for soliciting necessary funds from PTA, etc. for the purchase of medals and other needs.

G. Scholarship Opportunities - This committee will scout for talented students/pupils, refer them to the local philanthropies or civic spirited persons who may sponsor their studies, and/or refer them for screening to the CMLI for possible adoption as scholar.

III. SELECTION OF MODEL SCHOOL CHILDREN

A. Each school shall form its committee to select its model pupils/ students, at least one boy and one girl in each level. More may be named for each level as long as such pupils or students satisfy the criteria laid down. It is suggested that there be separate committee for each level.

Note: 1. A school offering the primary course only shall submit a minimum of one model boy and one model girl. The same is true in the case of a school offering only the intermediate course. A school offering complete primary, intermediate and secondary courses shall select a minimum of 6 model boys and 6 model girls, or a minimum total of 12 model youth.

2. A school offering literacy and other adult education courses for out-of-school youth (8 to 20 years) shall submit a minimum of one model out-of-school boy and one model out-of-school girl

B. Each school is requested to submit just one copy of the information sheet of each model school pupil/student selected.

C. Name and information sheets (form is hereto attached) of model pupils/students should be submitted to:

IV. AWARD CEREMONIES

Awarding ceremonies as part of an appropriate program shall be held simultaneously in the different schools on "Recognition Day" during the celebration of Children's Achievement Week annually sponsored by the CMLI, during commencement exercises or fitting special celebrations.

V. Citations or certificates of Recognition for each of the model pupils/ students shall be furnished free by the CMLI and shall be made available upon submission of names of model pupils/students at the CMLI headquarters. Medals may be awarded to the model school children and model adult education youths, if the Finance Committee is able to receive funds for the purpose from such possible sources as the PTA, Faculty Club, Student Council and other courses.

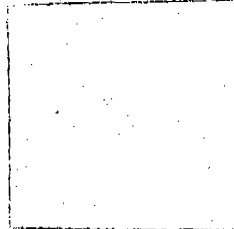

III. MEMBERSHIP IN THE CMLI NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY FOR SECONDARY STUDENTS

The second, third and fourth year students from private and public high schools whose names appear on record as having been recipients of an award as model students as defined by the CMLI Citizenship Training and Character Building Committee constitute the group from which prospective members will be drawn. This means that as a model student, a prospective candidate has undergone previous selection on the basis of the following:

Character - - - - -	30%
Scholastic Standing - - - - -	30%
Participation in School and Community Program and Extra Curricular Activities - - - - -	20%
Creativity or Special Talent - - - - -	10%
Health - - - - -	10%

Re- Character and Conduct

This is the sum total of the character traits, habits and conduct of the candidate which could serve as an index to his nature as a person. That standing on character and conduct shall be based on the combined judgement of all subject teachers of the candidate.

Re - Scholastic Standing

This constitutes the final general average of the candidate in his academic, vocational, and YDT/CAT subjects to which his grade for character is integrated.

Re - Participation in School and Community Program and Activities

This refers to the number of activities in which the candidate participated as well as to the quality of his performance.

Re - Creativity and Special Talent

This refers to the quality and purposes and extend to which his gifts of creativity and talent are utilized.

Re - Health

This gives, as much as possible, equal weight to physical and mental health.

Among the candidates, one may be recommended by the Regional Committee to be a member of the Philippine National CMLI Honor Society of Secondary School Students if:

1. He has made some outstanding achievement in any field like literary writing, debates, science, community service, civic projects, acts of heroism and valor, etc. which is to be supported by documentary evidence like an award or certificates.
2. He is a high school student who belong to the first five of the total members of his curriculum level, the ratings to be based on the last grading period.
3. Nomination for membership should be submitted at the close of the school year but not later than the opening of the following school year.

IV. LENGTH OF MEMBERSHIP

A member continues to be in good standing if he maintains the standards based on concrete evidence of good character, merit, achievement, and leadership.

When a member enters college, he automatically becomes an honorary member.

V. BASES FOR DISQUALIFICATION

1. Any member who does not belong to the first five of the members of his curriculum year in the following school year is disqualified until he regains his scholastic status.

2. Any member who is reported and found guilty of grave misdemeanor.

VI. HOW THE CMLI PHILIPPINE NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY OF SECONDARY SCHOOL STUDENTS BE GOVERNED

The Philippine National Honor Society of Secondary School Students shall be governed by a Board of Directors composed of fifteen members including the president, vice-president, secretary, treasurer, auditor, business manager and press relations officer.

VII. SPONSOR OF THE CMLI PHILIPPINE NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY OF SECONDARY SCHOOL STUDENTS

A-1 FILIPINO CHILDREN

- I. This project is open to bonafide Filipino secondary school students and elementary school pupils public and private schools and Filipino children served by the municipal health centers of the Philippines.
- II. The A-1 Filipino child shall be judge on the following basis:

A. Physical attributes	50%
Height and weight	20%
Skin	10%
Musculature	10%
Posture	10%
B. Mental and emotional development	30%
C. Immunization	10%
(The child must have at least five immunization)	
D. Dental	10%
Total	<hr/> 100%

General Criteria:

- A. Cleanliness and neatness
- B. Gains weight and height regularly
- C. Teeth complete, clean irregular (corrected if any)
- D. Cheerful disposition
- E. Immunization against communicable diseases
- F. Well-nourished
- G. Eyes normal
- H. Good Posture
- I. Freedom from skin diseases
- J. Satisfactory class achievement

- III. Participants with the following defects shall be automatically eliminated:

- A. Those with generalized skin eruptions
- B. Those who have never been under the supervision of a health agency, public or private, and those who have never sought the aid of a nurse, dentist, physician, or midwife.

IV. Selection:

- A. Children under the supervision of Health Centers but not in school (3-6 years old)
 - 1. Each health center shall select one boy and one girl, 3-6 years old.

2. It shall organized its own Board of Judges whose decision shall be held final.

3. Results and list of awardees shall be submitted to the Children's Museum and Library, Inc., East Avenue, Quezon City, P.O. Box 1610, Manila not later than October 15, 1982. *allc.*

B. Children under the supervision of schools.

1. Each school shall select one boy and one girl from each class, based on the DPS form 58 "Health Examination/Inspection Record" and the cumulative health record of the pupils.

2. The decision of the Board of Judges shall be held final. The results and list of A-1 children should be submitted to the Children's Museum and Library, Inc., P.O. Box 1610, Manila not later than October 15, 1982. *allc.*

V. AWARDS

A. A-1 children shall be given free citations or certificates by the CMLI and shall be made available after submission of the names of awardees at the CMLI, duly certified by the respective Board of Judges.

B. Medals may be awarded to the A-1 children, 24-karat gold plated medals bearing the CMLI seal are available at the office of the Children's Museum and Library, Inc., on East Avenue, Quezon City, if ordered at P22.00. Civic spirited citizens or organizations may sponsor or underwrite the cost of this medals which may be awarded at a fitting ceremony on occasion, preferable on Recognition day on February 25, 1983 during the Children's and Youth's Achievement Week held on February 20 to February 26, 1983 sponsored by the CMLI. THE CMLI NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY OF SECONDARY STUDENTS

I. INTRODUCTION:

For the promotion of leadership and further development of citizenship and character, the CMLI National Honor Society of Secondary School Students is being organized under the auspices of the Citizenship Training and Character Building Committee of the Children's Museum and Library, Inc., from among selected high school students who have been awardees or chosen as model students based on the criteria set by the said committee. Like any honor society, the organization shall work integrity and standards of excellence which will be the bases for the selection and retention of members.

II. OBJECTIVES:

The objectives of the CMLI National Honor Society of Secondary Students are:

1. To promote academic excellence and vocational efficiency;
2. To encourage members to participate actively in school and community developmental activities;
3. To provide opportunities for the youth to assert their rights and assume their responsibilities as members of a democratic society;
4. To enhance love of God and Country and services to fellowmen

Re - The promotion of academic Excellence and Vocational Efficiency

As an acknowledge model student, a member of this honor society is expected to demonstrate appreciation for his God-given gifts by planning out his activities such that they would lead to further enhance his intellectual capabilities, talents and vocational skills.

Re - Active Participation in School and Community Development Activities

The member is expected to take leadership roles or get actively involved in school and community organizations, program, assemblies, exhibits, projects, campaign on other cultural or social activities to heighten his leadership qualities, particularly his organizational skills.

Re - Opportunities for the Youth to Assert their Rights and Assume their Responsibilities.

Each day means a series of activities in which each individual is offered golden opportunities to perform his various roles as son/daughter, big or kid brother or sister, relative, classmate, schoolmate, student, citizen. Each day offers situations in which one has to stand by his rights or speak in respect for others rights. A member of this honor society is expected to perform their role by accepted norms of honor and dignity.

Re - Love of God and Country and Service to Fellowmen

Neither ritual nor the risk of life, but the many things, big and small that one can do to help or make others happy is asked of a member of this honor society. It means giving up one's personal interest for the common welfare; it means integrity, modesty, simplicity, courtesy, cleanliness, humility, helpfulness; it means being honorable, not just acquiring a heap of honors.
