UNDERGRADUATE SCHOLARSHIP

To: Bureau Directors
Regional Directors
Schools Superintendents
Presidents, State Colleges and Universities
Heads of Private Schools, Colleges and Universities.

1. The National Science and Technology Authority (NSTA) will award forty (40) scholarship slots at the Philippine Normal College (PNC) to those who will pursue any of the two courses of study: BS Physics for Teachers or BS Mathematics for Teachers.
2. Applicants must be qualified for graduation from any public or authorized private high school in March 1983.
3. Each secondary school principal is requested to nominate only one (1) candidate who will take the PNC examination as a pre-selection test on January 31, 1983 from 7:00 in the morning to 12:00 noon at the division office where his school belongs.
4. The first three highest examinees on the division level will compete in the regional examination on February 27, 1983 at any of the designated testing centers or at any center of his choice.
5. Each nominee from far-flung provinces like Batanes, Catanduanes, Palawan, Samar and Sulu will take the PNC examination in their respective division offices on February 27, 1983, 7:00 to 12:00 in the morning. The three examinees who will get the first three highest scores will immediately take the NSTA examination in the afternoon of the same day, February 27.
6. The awardees will be selected on the bases of their performance on the NCSE, the 1983 NSTA-SPI-PNC Regional Scholarship Examination, PNC Pre-Selection Examination and the submitted documents.

7. The guidelines for scholarship qualifications, scholarship privileges, requirements, list of documents to be submitted and the guidelines for selection and other pertinent information are enclosed with this Memorandum.
8. Announcement of the awardees shall be made by the NSIS-SPI-PAC Project Office through the Ministry of Education, Culture and Sports.
9. Immediate dissemination of the contents of this Memorandum is desired.

Undergraduate Scholarship

I. General Information

A. Scholarships

The National Science and Technology Authority shall award forty (40) scholarships to those who elect to pursue any of the following courses of study:

- BS Physics for Teachers
- BS Mathematics for Teachers

B. Qualifications of an Applicant

1. Must be qualified for graduation from any public or authorized private high school in March 1983;
2. Must be classified within the upper 10% of the graduating class;
3. Must be natural-born citizen of the Philippines and a resident of the region he is representing;
4. Must be in good health and of good moral character;
5. Must be willing to return to his region to teach physics/mathematics in the secondary school;
6. Must be willing to accept a scholarship grant in accordance with one's economic status as follows:
 - a. full scholarship
 - b. partial
 - c. honorific

C. Scholarship's privileges per academic year

1. Actual tuition and other school fees as billed by the Philippine Normal College and/or De La Salle University;
2. Prescribed textbooks and essential school supplies; first and second years at P500/yr. and subsequent years at P600/yr.;

3. Prescribed military science and physical education uniforms of ₱240/yr. during the first two years;
4. Free transportation for one economy-class round trip between the parent's residence and the Philippine Normal College;
5. Monthly living allowances for ten-month duration of ₱600, ₱370, ₱230 for full, partial, and honorific respectively, depending on the income bracket of the parent/guardian of the awardee.

Additional allowance during summer of the third year.

Seven weeks allowance

Actual purchase of books and essential school supplies not to exceed ₱100.

D. Scholarship Requirements

1. College Placement. - An awardee shall enroll at the Philippine Normal College;
2. An awardee must maintain a weighted average of 83 or better;
3. Immediately upon completion of his bachelor's degree an awardee shall serve as a full time mathematics/physics teacher in a secondary school in his own region for a minimum period equivalent to the length of time he enjoyed this scholarship;
4. An awardee shall comply with the terms of a scholarship agreement to be entered into between himself, parent/guardian and NSTA-PNC.

E. Documents to be Submitted:

1. NSTA-PNC Information Sheet, using attached Form A
2. Certification from the high school principal using attached Form B, on the following:
 - a. List of qualified applicants of the school;
 - b. qualification for graduation in March 1983;



- c. the applicants belong to the upper 10% of the graduating class and their specific class rank as of the 3rd grading period;
 - d. total number of candidates for graduation.
3. Health certification from a qualified physician, using attached Form C.
 4. Certification on good moral character from the Guidance Counselor/Principal, using attached Form D.
 5. Two 2" by 2" pictures taken recently; one to be attached to the NSTA-PSC information sheet and the other to the notice of admission for the regional examination.
 6. Certification by the applicant of his willingness to teach high school physics and mathematics after graduation in the region of residence, using Form E.
 7. Xerox copy of the 1982 Income Tax Return for the year of parent/guardian.

Guidelines for Selection

1. On the Division Level

- a. Documents (See General Information E) to be submitted by applicant to the principal of the high school within the school division.
- b. Principal nominates one candidate for the high school on the basis of all forms indicated in General Information E to the division superintendent. Deadline January 19, 1983 or

The aforesaid documents (See General Information E) required of the applicant-nominee should be submitted to the division superintendent or nominee takes along documents to the division office on the PSC examination date, January 31, 1983.*

*Each high school nominee from far flung provinces such as Batanes, Catanduanes, Palawan, Samar and Sulu will take the PSC examination in their respective division offices on Sunday, February 27, at 7-12 A.M. The three highest in the division will immediately take the NSTA examination on the afternoon of the same day, February 27.

- c. Each high school nominee will then take the PNC examination as a pre-selection test on Monday, January 31, 1983 from 7:00 - 12:00 A.M. at the division office under the supervision of the division Superintendent or his duly authorized representative.*
 - d. The first three highest examinees in the division level will automatically be the division nominees to compete in the regional examination.
 - e. The division superintendent issues out a notice of admission to each of the three highest qualified nominees for the regional examination.
 - f. The division superintendent sends to the PNC President the names of the three nominees with their pertinent papers and their test results and also a complete list of other examinees with their test results.*
- On the Regional level
- a. All division nominees will take the final selection test (NSIA Examination) at any of the designated testing centers or at any center of his choice.
 - b. The examinees shall defray from personal funds or funds solicited from local sources his subsistence and transportation expenses to and from the examination center of the region.
 - c. The awardees shall be selected on the basis of the following:
 1. Performance on:
 - a. National College Entrance Examination
 - b. 1983 NSTA-SPE-PNC Regional Scholarship Examination
 - c. PNC Pre-Selection Examination
 2. Submitted documents (See General Information E)

- d. Forty scholarship slots (20 for physics and 20 for mathematics) shall be awarded to the qualified candidates from the 13 regions of the country who get the highest scores in their respective regions, provided that such scores fall within the prescribed minimum acceptable scores.
 - e. Selection of qualified examinees for the scholarship award after approval of the NSIA Director General is final and unappealable.
 - f. Announcement of the awardees shall be made by the NSIA-SPI-PMC Project Office through the MECOS.
