BVNS 1983 SUMMER CLASSES

To: Bureau Directors

Heads of Private Schools, Colleges and Universities

1. The summer classes at the Baguio Vacation Normal School (BVNS), Teachers Camp, Baguio City, will commence on April 18 and end on May 28, 1983.

2. BVNS offers both undergraduate and graduate courses with the following areas of specialization:

- a. Master of Arts in Education major in Educational Management (School Administration and Supervision), Educational Media, Adult and Community Education, Guidance and Counseling, Communication Arts (English and Filipino), Social Studies Education, Science Education, Mathematics Education, Music Education, Functional Literacy, Home Economics and Youth Volunteer Management.
- b. Master of Arts in Teaching (MAT) with fields of concentration in Pre-Elementary Education, School Health Education, Home Economics and Physical Education.
- c. Courses on Functional Literacy, a special masteral program for teachers of ethnic minorities, which will entitle the participants to a certificate of attendance (if taken as non-credit) or as academic requirements in specific areas of specialization towards a master's degree.
- d. Special courses (undergraduate) in Music Education, Physical Education or any field of concentration offered at the graduate level.







3. The specific subjects for each of the above courses are reflected in Inclosure No. 1.

4. Short term leadership courses which are supportive to the various educational thrusts of the Ministry of Education, Culture and Sports are also offered at BVNS. Teacher-students enrolled in any of the leadership courses can be given certificates of attendance or equivalent credits towards a master's degree.

5. School officials and teachers from government as well as non-government schools are enjoined to enroll in the courses offered at BVNS. All the requirements and other information related to the summer classes at BVNS this summer are found in Inclosure No. 2.

6. To facilitate the organization of classes, teacher-students and other school personnel wishing to enroll at BVNS this summer should accomplish Inclosure No. 3 for advanced registration. The accomplished form should be sent to the Registrar, Baguio Vacation Normal School (BVNS), Teachers Camp, Baguio City, not later than April 5, 1963.

7. It is desired that the contents of this Memorandum be given widest publicity possible.



GENERAL INFORMATION CONCERNING BVS ENROLMENT  
AND OTHER INFORMATION

1. Registration for enrolment at the BVNS will be from April 1 to 16, 1983. Advanced registration by mail using the prescribed form (Inclosure No. 3) will be accepted. A fine of not exceeding five pesos (P5.00) will be imposed on employees who enrol after the scheduled enrolment period. No student will be admitted after the first week of classes.
2. Teacher-students seeking admission at the BVNS for the first time should submit a duly accomplished application form together with his/her original transcript of Records upon registration.
3. The fees to be charged are as follows:
  - a. Matriculation fee . . . . . P10.00
  - b. Tuition fee . . . . .
    - (1) Undergraduate . . . . .

Additional Course . . . . . P15.00
    - (2) Graduate  
One Unit . . . . . P15.00
4. Classes will be held 6 days a week, Monday through Saturday, one period of 60 minutes daily will be scheduled for each 2-unit course; 90 minutes for each 3-unit course; and 145 minutes for each course requiring laboratory experiments.
5. The maximum study load for either the undergraduate or the graduate level is nine (9) units in accordance with BPS Circular No. 7, s. 1973. Graduate students not carrying the full load may enrol for credit in special undergraduate course provided that the total number of units shall not exceed nine (9) units. Those who take the full study load are allowed to enrol in one non-credit course.
6. Students enrolled in government schools/teachers colleges may enrol at the BVNS for vacation classes. They should present to the registrar of the BVNS their official Transcript of Records or Students' Permanent Records duly accomplished and signed by the Registrar of the school, teachers colleges and universities where they are enrolled during the regular school year.
