NATIONAL TRAINING CONFERENCE ON THE IMPLEMENTATION
OF THE DISTANCE LEARNING DELIVERY SYSTEM

To: Bureau Directors
Regional Directors
Schools Superintendents

1. In order to insure the effectiveness of the Distance Learning Delivery System, the Office of Nonformal Education, Ministry of Education, Culture and Sports will conduct a two-day national training conference on the implementation of the Distance Learning Delivery System for regional NFE supervisors and/or administrators on May 10-11, 1983 at OMECS Conference Room, Arroceros St., Manila.
2. The objectives of the training conference are to have the NFE supervisors/administrators:
 1. upgrade their knowledge, skills and attitudes in the Distance Learning Delivery System;
 2. be re-oriented on the philosophy and rationale of the Distance Learning Delivery System;
 3. gain competence in the use of instructional and other supplementary learning materials; and
 4. become aware of responsibilities and duties regarding the Distance Learning Delivery System program.
3. Participants shall conduct echo-conferences in their respective regions after the national conference.
4. Regional council shall coordinate with the division and district officials for the successful administration of the regional activity.
5. Accordingly, all regional directors are enjoined to inform and allow the participants to attend the conference on official time. Travel expenses, per diem and other miscellaneous fees shall be charged.
