BVS 1983 SPECIAL MUSIC EDUCATION AND YET COURSES

To: Bureau Directors
Regional Directors
School Superintendents
Presidents, State Colleges and Universities
Heads of Private Schools, Colleges and Universities

1. Recognizing the role of the Ministry of Education, Culture and Sports as a cultural agency, the Baguio Vacation Normal School in cooperation with the Bureau of Secondary Education and in association with the Cultural Center of the Philippines is offering this summer, April 18 to May 28, 1983, as per Memorandum No. 8, s. 1983, an Integrated YET/CAT course and two music education courses; Musical Stage Arts, and Children's Opera Education (Seminar in Music Education).

2. Musical Stage Arts will be under the direction of a MEC facilitator with outstanding authorities as guests. The focus will be on the following aspects of musical production:

Acting	:	Behn Corveros
Choreography	:	Cora Igigo
Choral Singing	:	George Hernandez
Opera Education	:	Clifford Brooks

3. To give greater depth and meaning to the course, the school, in association with the Cultural Center of the Philippines will present the zarzuela "Kapirangan" by Demetillo with script written by Orlando Madres. Direction will be by Tony Mabesa.

4. The second course Children's Opera Education will be under the direction of Mr. Clifford Brooks of the Boston Opera Company. The course will include an introduction to opera, aspects of opera production and development of educational materials like sample integrated lesson plans and case studies for documentation and replication purposes. Performances and Pre-Curtain Highlights will also be conducted.

5. The Integrated YDT course will be under the direction of a MDC facilitator with guest lecturers. Focus will be on content and strategies designed to help teachers gain functional knowledge of the different components of YIT (Music, P.E., Health, Scouting and CAI).

6. Immediate dissemination of the contents of this Memorandum to all concerned, particularly the deans of colleges of education and teacher educators handling YDT and music subjects is desired. Public and private schools teachers and supervisors may enroll for the course. Since the enrollment is limited, applications will be entertained on a first-come-first-serve basis.

1983 CCP KODALY SEMINAR-WORKSHOP

1. The Cultural Center of the Philippines, in coordination with the National Music Competitions for Young Artists Executive Board and the Ministry of Education, Culture and Sports, and in cooperation with the University of the Philippines and the University of Santo Tomas, will hold a Seminar-Workshop on the "Kodaly Method of Teaching Choruses" at the CCP Conference Room and Studio II on April 5-9, 1983 from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon, and from 1:00 to 5:00 p.m.

2. Three split classes are planned for this year's workshop: Level I for new enrollees, Level II for the Level I participants of last year, and a Level III class for the Level II participants of last year. These three classes will meet separately in the morning for the demonstration and theory classes, and all three classes will be combined for group singing, and conducting techniques and creative work in the afternoon. In the singing and conducting classes, Kodaly, Bartok and other contemporary choral works will be used.

3. The Level I participants of 1982 and those of 1981 who did not come last year are invited to enroll for the Level II class. The Level II class of last year will constitute the Level III class. A new Level I class will be organized for new enrollees. Certificates of attendance will be given to all participants. Participants in the UP Kodaly Seminar with Dr. Arpad Daraze are qualified to join Level II class.

4. Applicants for the new Level I class should be choral conductors and/or music teachers with a degree in music and who have been handling choruses for the past five years. Qualified regional and division supervisors, and gifted music teachers recommended by the Regional Director, are enjoined to enrol. Applicants are required to submit biodata (C.S. Form 212) indicating choral experiences for screening purposes to: Kodaly Seminar-Workshop 1983, c/o Prof. Rose Marie Banta, U.S.T. Conservatory of Music, Espana, Manila. Checks or money orders for the registration fee should be made out to the 1983 CCP-Kodaly Seminar-Workshop. 7. Levels I and II participants of 1982 are requested to bring along all their Kodaly music materials (333 Exercises, Pentatonic Songs, Zicinta Hungarica, etc.). Charges will be made for new or additional copies of said materials.

1983 NATIONAL CONFERENCE IN NONFORMAL EDUCATION
FOR PRIVATE SCHOOLS, COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES

To: Bureau Directors
Regional Directors
Schools Superintendents
Heads of Private Schools, Colleges and Universities

1. The 1983 National Conference in Nonformal Education for Private Schools, Colleges and Universities will be held on June 2-7, 1983 at the Aquinas University, Legazpi City. The conference will be sponsored by the Private Schools National Association in Nonformal Education (PRISMANFE) with the assistance of the Ministry of Education, Culture and Sports. The Aquinas University will act as host of the conference.
2. The theme of the conference will be "The Role of Private Education Institutions in Literacy Development." The discussions will center on what private schools, colleges and universities in the Philippines can contribute to the implementation of the national literacy program. The conference will also follow up the deliberations and recommendations of the National Literacy Forum held in Cebu City on July 6-9, 1982 and the Inter-agency discussions in connection with the National Literacy Week Celebration held in Manila on September 8-9, 1982.
3. Authorized to attend are the personnel in charge of nonformal education in private schools, colleges and universities and NFE regional supervisors. PRISMANFE will provide the cost of transportation and board and lodging. MECS regional NFE supervisors shall attend this seminar on official time only at their own expense. No government funds shall be used for this purpose.
