REPORT ON TRAINING WORKSHOP ON YOUTH DEVELOPMENT
AND CITIZEN ARMY TRAINING

A REPORT ON THE NATIONAL YDI-CAT TRAINING-WORKSHOP

I. Rationale

Observations and feedbacks on the implementation of the YDI-CAT program showed weaknesses particularly in the content and methodology. Annual reports from the regional offices revealed lack of qualified administrators and supervisors. Researches showed that YDI-CAT is the least supervised areas in the school curriculum thus resulting in poor instruction.

Considering the significance of an effective implementation of the YDI-CAT program, this training workshop was held to further develop the needed background and training for proper implementation and supervision of the program as a vehicle in developing strong, productive and upright citizens.

The three-week live-in training for YDI-CAT supervisors/ coordinators held at Teachers Camp from November 15 to December 4, 1982 under the auspices of the MECS Personnel Management and Development Office, Baguio Vacation Normal School, and the Bureau of Secondary Education was intended with the government's objective to develop strong nationhood through effective implementation of the YDI-CAT program.

II. Objectives

As stated in MECS Memorandum No. 242 dated October 8, 1982, the training-workshop for supervisors/coordinators aims to:

1. provide the participants with the essential supervisory skills and competencies to enable them to effectively implement and supervise the YDI-CAT program;
2. identify urgent needs and problems encountered in the implementation of the program;
3. assess the existing YDI curriculum frameworks and its suitability to meet the needs and interest of the students in one's locality;
4. formulate possible solutions or recommendations to the identified problems;

5. prepare resolutions for the improvement of the YDT-CAT program and its implementation.

The three-week training focused itself to the multiple problems encountered in the implementation and evaluation of the YDT-CAT program. The topics discussed by experts, the guidance of the consultants, and the sharing of experiences have enriched and reinforced the capabilities of the participants to effectively implement an improved and relevant YDT-CAT program through new approaches and strategies.

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ABSTRACT

YDT-CAT NATIONAL TRAINING WORKSHOP FOR SUPERVISORS/COORDINATORS

The NECS Personnel Management and Development Office in cooperation with the BVNS with the assistance of the Curriculum Development Division, Bureau of Secondary Education, conducted a three-week live-in national training workshop for an improved implementation of the YDT-CAT Program. The objective of this training was to strengthen supervisory skills and competencies for effective supervision of the YDT-CAT program.

The training-workshop was held in pursuing the objective for a very important reason - to draw together responsible and experienced people to work with one another and with experts and consultants on the problems of implementation and supervision of the YDT-CAT program. The key elements in the training which came into play were active participation by each participant, good human relations, group rapport and effective communication. A total of 109 delegates attended the training. The services of experts in PE, Health, Music and Scouting were availed of. The training included lectures, discussions, demonstrations, observations and practicum. Some of the highlights of the training were:

1. Presentation of regional reports on the problems and needs encountered in the implementation of the YDT-CAT program and what they are doing along this line. On the basis of the various reports presented, lectures of resource speakers, proceedings of the group discussions, and in line with the definition that YDT-CAT is a broad range of concerted activities relating to teaching, learning situations and experiences which attempt to maximize opportunities for the intellectual, emotional, psychological and physiological development of young people, recommendations and resolutions were formulated to serve as guidelines for future planning and implementation.
2. Cultural Night consisting of authentic songs, dances and religious rites from the different regions in which the participants showed their skills and expertise in dancing, singing, acting and creativity.
3. Demonstration on how to play the different Asian musical instruments by Dr. Lucrecia Kasilag. She gave emphasis on the ancient instruments of the

Philippines. The participants had a chance of displaying their skills in playing the instruments. The day's activities were fruitfully accomplished.

4. Lecture-demonstration on physical fitness by Dr. Aparicio Negui which aims for social integration. The lecture was made interesting and informative through a practical on the hour and why of running at the track oval of the Gintong Alay National Training Center at 6:00 a.m. The lecture provided an occasion for individual doubts on the objectives of physical fitness.
5. Dancing sessions under Dr. Carmen Andin was enthusiastically enjoyed by the participants. Delegates had a taste of "Aerobic Dancing" - an unexpected but very much welcome activity. Dr. Andin lectured on the physiological, and psychological benefits of dancing. A sample workout was given to the participants.
6. Dr. Kojillano's lecture on Creative Teaching, Strategies, Supervision, and Values Clarification as applied to Health Education was considered by the delegates as a most profitable and enlightening experience of listening and reacting. She encouraged active and creative exchange of ideas among students and the internalization of desirable values. Stress was given to clinical supervision which provides the foundation for the development of a democratic and professional relationship between teacher and supervisor.
7. Discussion of problems and controversies relative to the implementation of the CAT program by Brigadier General Benjamin Vollejo, a top ranking luminary from the Ministry of National Defense. He expounded on the different sections of the CAT Manual and clarified doubts regarding Tactical Inspection, CGCC Training, Uniforms, Exemptions, and Bivouacs.

The three-week training culminated in the graduation of the 109 delegates. The occasion was graced by the presence of Director Andres R. Asistin of the Bureau of Secondary Education, DECS, Dr. Lourdes Sumagaysay, BWS Superintendent, and Miss Hortensia Benosa, Assistant Secretary for Personnel Management and Development, DECS as guest speaker. Concern and awareness of the significance of YDP-CAT as a subject was emphasized by Miss Benosa because according to her it is a subject that has all the potentials of developing a well-rounded personality as well as cultural development among the youth.
