THE SEVENTH COMPETITION OF THE MECS-PHILANLIFE
SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM IN GUIDANCE (GRADUATE LEVEL)

To: Bureau Directors
Regional Directors
Schools Superintendants

Heads of Private Schools, Colleges and Universities

1. The Ministry of Education, Culture and Sports (MECS) through the National Educational Testing Center (NETC) announces the seventh phase (1983-1985) of the MECS-Philanlife Scholarship Program in Guidance (Graduate Level) which will commence during the second semester of school year 1983-1984.

2. For the information and guidance of the field, the various activities relative to the competition are scheduled as follows:

- a. May 16, 1983 - Receipt of application forms and information sheets by the MECS regional offices from the main or regional offices of the Philippine-American Life Insurance Company for distribution to school division offices.
- b. June 27, 1983 - Last day for the submission by schools superintendants of the names and supporting papers of the candidates of their respective divisions to the regional director.
- c. July 15, 1983 - Deadline for the submission of nomination letters and all supporting papers of at least five (5) nominees from each region by the regional director to:

- d. August 1-12, 1983 - Testing and interview of candidates by the MECS-UP teams in the venue chosen by the regional director for the NCE orientation seminar.
- e. September 26, 1983 - Final selection of scholars by the MECS-Philanlife-UP Scholarship Committee.

- f. October 17-31, 1983 - Announcement of scholars, orientation and pre-enrollment activities.
- g. November 2, 1983 - Registration in the university by the scholars.

3. Attention is invited to paragraph 4 of Department Memorandum No. 136, s. 1978, on Guidelines on the Continuing Program on Guidance. Specifically, the paragraph stipulates among other things that candidates for the scholarship should be high school teachers and/or guidance counselors who are not over forty years old. They should have obtained an overall grade-point average of not less than 2.5 and should have no failing grade in their undergraduate course.

4. Attention is likewise invited to paragraph 5 of the aforementioned Memorandum which enumerates the supporting documents that should accompany each nomination. Further, other scholarship requirements are specified in paragraphs 3 and 4 of MEC Memorandum No. 165, s. 1978.

5. Inclosed is the tentative schedule of testing and interview of the candidates from the various regions.

6. It is requested that the contents of this Memorandum be given the widest publicity so that qualified candidates from far-flung school divisions may be nominated.

PRODED-ERP EDUCATIONAL SYSTEMS-MANAGEMENT PROGRAM
(ES-M) FOR SUBJECT AREA SUPERVISORS

To: Bureau Directors
Regional Directors
Schools Superintendents
Chiefs of Services and Heads of Units
Presidents, State Colleges and Universities
Heads of Private Schools, Colleges and Universities

1. To insure smooth and effective implementation of the New Elementary School Curriculum (NESC) starting school year 1983-1984, the PRODED-ERP Educational Systems Management Program (ES-M) for Subject Area supervisors will be conducted in the different regional centers for 4½ days within the period May 23-June 10, 1983. This program will be handled by the PRODED Subject Area Trainers (Cf. MECS Memorandum No. 97, s. 1983) with assistance from the PRODED Regional Trainers.

2. The objectives of the program are as follows:

- a. Develop in the participants personal and interpersonal skills necessary for effective supervision.
- b. Orient the supervisors on their role/responsibilities in PRODED and in the total school system.
- c. Equip supervisors with strategies for mastery learning in the ER's and in *Gitika at Kultura*.
- d. Improve specific supervisory skills pertinent to their functions.
- e. Assist participants in the preparation of an action plan for improved, NESC-oriented supervision.
- f. Clarify issues and problems related to the implementation of the NESC.

3. In consideration of the immediate requirements for BESS implementation by Grade I teachers starting June 1983, the first group of supervisors who will participate in this training program are those in the following learning areas: English, Filipino, Mathematics and Science or Kultura.

4. Expenses incidental to the training program shall be chargeable against the funds of PSCYED-ESD subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations.

5. It is desired that this Memorandum be disseminated to all concerned.

ACCELERATION OF FRONT-LINE STAFF TRAINING
IN PREPARATION FOR NESC IMPLEMENTATION

To: Bureau Directors
Regional Directors
School Superintendents
Chiefs of Services and Heads of Units

Presidents, State Colleges and Universities

1. With reference to NESC Memorandum No. 73, s. 1983, the following accelerated training schedule for all those who will play key roles in the NESC implementation this June is being issued.

- a. Grade I Teachers: FRONT-LINE's Teacher Formation Program (TFP) will reach at least 70% of those in affected districts by June 13 and 100% by the end of July.

All teachers in non-affected districts will be trained from May 30 to June 13, 1983 by FRONT-LINE associate trainers.

- b. Principals/head teachers: In order to prepare them for their role as principal support of the teachers in NESC implementation, the Instructional Planning and Management Program (IPMP) launched last December will hold sessions during the summer. Those who cannot be accommodated in the summer schedule will have to avail of intensive NESC Orientations to be conducted by Division Subject Area Supervisors and FRONT-LINE Trainers. It is expected that by the end of September, all principals/head teachers shall have attended an IPMP session.

- c. Subject Area Supervisors: Selected regional and division supervisors, with the IED Chief of each region shall attend the first session of DAP's Instructional Systems Management Program (ISMP) at DAP Tagaytay from April 30 to May 2. This group will use train their peers in their respective regions so that all division subject area supervisors in Division, Division, Division and Sibika at Kalamang will be ready to orient principals and teachers on ISMP requirements and instructional materials before the opening of classes.
- d. Schools Superintendents: Starting on May 15th division schools superintendents shall attend a FRODIP-TRP program which is tailored to their particular needs. This ESMP program will be held in DAP Tagaytay and each session will last for 5-6 days.

2. The TRP Regional Training staff in each region shall disseminate the specific schedule of training sessions for the region.

3. Superintendents are enjoined to ensure the availability of all concerned for their respective training sessions.

4. As stated in a previous memorandum on this matter service credits will accrue to participants of FRODIP-TRP training, in accordance with existing Ministry policies and procedures.

5. Immediate dissemination of this Memorandum is desired.
