UNITED WAY PHILIPPINES EDUCATION AND FUND CAMPAIGN

To: Bureau Directors
Regional Directors
Chiefs of Services and Heads of Units
Schools Superintendents
Presidents, State Colleges and Universities
Heads of Private Schools, Colleges and Universities
Vocational School Superintendents/Administrators

1. The United Way Philippines, Inc. (formerly Community Chests and Councils of the Philippines, Inc.), is an organization actively engaged in funding community health and welfare services as well as in promoting the economic well-being of people in the different parts of the country.
2. Proclamation No. 2208 issued by the Office of the President dated June 14, 1982 authorizes the United Way Philippines to conduct an annual education and fund campaign. The Proclamation calls upon all residents, of whatever race or creed, business firms, organizations, and all government officials and the Armed Forces of the Philippines, and all government owned and controlled corporations to fully support the campaign of the United Way Philippines by giving generously of their means and volunteer efforts to this annual appeal campaign for the promotion of the health, welfare and economic well-being of our less fortunate and underprivileged countrymen.
3. In view of the laudable objectives of this campaign, it is requested that school officials, teachers and other school personnel as well as pupils and students give their support to this campaign. There shall be, however, no compulsion or any form of coercion upon school teachers, pupils and students in the solicitation of contributions for the policy of this Ministry in fund campaigns, no matter how meritorious, is strictly voluntary.
4. In remitting collections, checks or money orders should be drawn in favor of the local United Way chapter. If there is no organized local chapter in the province/city, collections should be forwarded direct

to United Way Philippines, Inc., 63 Nasikay Extension, Diliman, Quezon City. A list of active United Way local chapters is inclosed. Copies of the report on remittances should be transmitted to Deputy Minister Hermenegildo C. Dumlao, Vice President, United Way Philippines, Inc., Ministry of Education, Culture and Sports, Manila. Campaign fund receipts will be provided by the local chapter for remittances of chapter levels, and United Way Philippines, Inc. on the national level.

5. Dissemination of this Memorandum to all concerned is requested.
