INTERNATIONAL CAMP FOR GLOBAL COOPERATION AND PEACE

To: Bureau Directors
Regional Directors
Chiefs of Services and Heads of Units
Schools Superintendents
Presidents, State Colleges and Universities
Heads of Private Schools, Colleges and Universities
Vocational School Superintendents/Administrators

1. The National Federation of UNESCO Clubs and Associated Schools in the Philippines (NFUCASP), and the National Research Development Centre for Teacher Education, Ministry of Education, Culture and Sports, in collaboration with the Asian Federation of UNESCO Clubs and Associations (AFUCA), Tokyo, Japan, World Federation of UNESCO Clubs and Associations (WFUCA), the UNESCO National Commission of the Philippines and UNESCO Paris will sponsor an International Camp for Global Cooperation and Peace, integrating the Eighth Biennial Seminar-Conference of the NFUCASP, on October 17-22, 1983, at the Don Mariano Marcos Memorial State University (DMMU), Bacolod, La Union.

2. The objectives of the international camp are: a) to articulate ideas and opinions in discussing contemporary world problems affecting the world community; b) to provide experience to UNESCO Club teacher advisers, school administrators, supervisors, and teacher educators on how to run a camp for global cooperation and peace; and c) to suggest possible solutions to solve present problems through creative posters, paintings, drawings, writing, declaiming, singing and choreographed interpretations on the following themes:

- Disarmament or Arms Race;
- The New International Economic Order and the New World Information and Communications Order;
- Declaration and Defense of Human Rights;
Basic Liberties and the Rights of Peoples;
- Ecological Balance of Man and His Biosphere; and
- Youth: Future of Tomorrow.

3. Expected output from the above objectives are: on-the-spot creative posters, paintings, drawings, songs or poetry related to the themes mentioned above; written essays; oratorical or declamation manuscripts; three-minute extemporaneous talk using lottery for the theme; skits, simulation, playlets, games as well as formal and informal discussions.
4. Secondary school students, aged 15 to 18, from Asia, Oceania and other parts of the world have been invited by WFUCA using the following criteria: (a) proficiency in oral and written English; (b) good moral character, certified by the principal; (c) leadership and creative skills; (d) good health, certified by a government physician; and (e) membership in the UNESCO Club.
5. Inclosure No. 1 is a list of national official delegates invited to participate in the International Camp and the Eighth Biennial Seminar-Conference of the WFUCASP. It is desired that these participants be informed immediately of their involvement. If any delegate listed in the inclosure cannot attend, the National Coordinator or Director of the International Camp for Global Cooperation and Peace, NEDCTE, Ministry of Education, Culture and Sports, Arroceros Street, Manila, should be informed immediately so as to allow readjustment in transportation, lodging and accommodation.
6. Inclosure No. 2 is a list of institutions from where the youth participants will be collected. The name of the qualified student and an alternate must be submitted on or before August 31, 1983, by filling Inclosure No. 3. The NEDCTE Secretariat will communicate to the Principal on how to get the round trip ticket of the selected student.
7. All official participants from Regions III to XII, including the NCR, will meet meantime in front of YMCA, Concepcion Street, Manila to take airconditioned buses for Bacolod, La Union, leaving at 1:00 sharp in the afternoon of October 17, 1983. The organizers will not be held responsible to pay the transportation of any delegate who fails to take this trip.
8. The WFUCA and UNESCO Paris will defray the round-trip economy class transportation of officially invited foreign and local participants. The National Research and Development Centre for Teacher Education, Ministry of Education, Culture and Sports, will sponsor the board and lodging of official delegates starting from lunch of October 17 to lunch of October 22, 1983. A registration fee of P350 for adult delegates, and an allowance of P10 a day, are chargeable against regional, division, school or local funds, subject to availability of funds and the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations.

9. Schools Superintendents, UNESCO Club Advisors and other school officials whose names do not appear in the list are authorized to attend this international camp provided that all their expenses, including board and lodging of P45 a day, may be charged against division, school or local funds.

10. Immediate dissemination of the contents of this Memorandum to all concerned is desired.
