SIXTH COUNTRY COURSE ON TECHNICAL AND VOCATIONAL  
EDUCATION PROJECT IMPLEMENTATION

To: Bureau Directors  
Regional Directors  
Presidents, State Colleges and Universities  
Vocational School Superintendents/Administrators

1. The Ministry of Education, Culture and Sports through the Technical and Vocational Education Project, announces the holding of the 6th Country Course on Technical and Vocational Education Project Implementation in cooperation with the Colombo Plan Staff College for Technician Education on August 8-19, 1983, at the Marikina Institute of Science and Technology, Marikina, Metro Manila.
2. The main objective of the country course is to train the key personnel of the TVEP-PMU Staff and those from the twenty-three selected Technical Education Institutes covered under the Project Loan No. 531-PMI for program implementation of the technician education project.
3. Participants to this workshop are Heads of Technical Departments who are designated as Deputy Project Director, Heads of Academic Department, Guidance Counselors or Coordinator and Senior Staff of Project Management Unit and from the Technical and Financial Services serving the Technical and Vocational Education Project.
4. Theme of the course and the tentative activities on a day-to-day schedule are included for ready reference. Participants should bring along materials needed in the course, such as the organizational structure of the school Project Implementation Unit and the duties and responsibilities of the personnel involved in technician education.
5. Travel expenses of participants from station to MIST and back shall be charged against local school funds, subject to the usual accounting and auditing regulations. The cost of the 2-week country course which covers board and lodging of participants for the duration of the seminar, cost of supplies







and materials and fees for local lecturers shall be charged against the Government counterpart fund of the Project. Participants are advised to be at MIST one day before the start of the course.

5. The cost for foreign training staff/lecturers which includes international travel expenses, board and lodging, and faculty time fee shall be borne by the regular country course fund of Colombo Plan Staff College.

7. This Memorandum should be given the widest publicity possible.


