YOUTH LEADERS AND CAMPUS ADVISERS REGIONAL ASSEMBLIES

To: Bureau Directors
Regional Directors
Schools Superintendents
Presidents, State Colleges and Universities
Heads of Private Schools, Colleges and Universities

1. In response to the government's call on the youth for a massive involvement in national development, the YMCA of Manila, with the cooperation of the Ministry of Education, Culture and Sports, will hold the Youth Leaders and Campus Advisers Regional assemblies in the 13 regions in the Philippines in August and September this year.
2. Each of the 13 regions will hold a 3-day assembly to be participated in by 100 outstanding youths and student leaders. Arrangements shall be made by Hon. Horacio Gildardo C. Dulao, chairman of the College Work Committee of the YMCA of Manila, through Dr. Placido C. Neri, Jr., program secretary of the YMCA of Manila, together with the regional directors of this ministry. The program of activities shall be carried out in each region in accordance with the enclosed guidelines for the assemblies.
3. The Youth Leaders Regional Assembly is open to college students and other youth leaders, preferably those with experience in handling youth projects and activities both in-campus and off-campus. The Campus Advisers Regional Assembly is open to faculty members involved in campus organization projects/activities. A youth delegate must be recommended by a school, college or university head or by the head of the organization.
4. All schools, colleges and universities are urged to participate in the assemblies. Heads of schools, colleges and universities are authorized to send delegates to the assemblies. Only 100 delegates for the Youth Leaders and 50 for the Campus Advisers, will be accepted on a first-come, first-served basis. Deadline for submission of application forms for the delegates of Regions I, II, III, IV and V is August 30 while for Regions VI, VII, VIII, IX, X, XI and XII is September 1. All application forms should be submitted to the concerned Regional Director or his duly authorized representative or the Coordinator to be appointed from the host school.

5. Youth Leaders and Advisors fees of ₱60.00 which covers two meals, training materials, certificate, and other expenses that may be incurred in connection with attendance thereto, shall be borne by the school, college or university represented therein or by any private organization. In this connection, attention is invited to paragraph 3 of MEC Order No. 17, s. 1952, requiring the submission by the sponsor of a post audit report of the collections and disbursements, which should be strictly complied with.

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
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
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












1. THE YOUTH
