



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GENERAL RULES

REGULAR

- a. Regional contests shall be held to select entries of the regions. Each regional competition shall decide on the date, time and place of its regional competition. It is suggested that regional competitions should be held at least one month before the national competition.
- b. For purposes of the contests, the regional setup of the Ministry of Education and Culture shall be followed.
- c. Each region may send one entry each in the following categories:

1) High school Division	2) College Division
3) Intermediate Division	4) Secondary Division
5) All-grade Division	6) All-grade Division
7) Mixed Division	8) Mixed Division
- d. Regional winners may be given prizes if the respective regions so desire.

NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

- The National Festival Finals shall be held to choose the three best groups in each category. Competition will be held Saturday, June 10, 1984, at 6:00 p.m., the place to be announced later.

NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP FINALS

- a. The national championship phase of the festival shall be tentatively held on Saturday, June 10, 1984, at 6:00 p.m., the group to be unopposed. Any protest in writing to and from the venue of the competition, audience, band and lighting shall be borne by such participating group.
- b. Transportation to and from the competition festival site shall be provided by the participating cities.
- c. The national management, if requested and given enough time, shall make arrangements for flights, accommodations, transportation and other necessities pertaining to and from the contest site.

JUDGING AND SCORING REQUIREMENTS

- a. The following standards shall be used in judging the winners for each division, both in the preliminaries and finals:

- a. Technical quality . . . . . 35%
  - 1) Interpretation
  - 2) Lightness
  - 3) Blocking

- b. Interpretation . . . . . 35%
  - 1) Expression
  - 2) Interpretation
  - 3) Storytelling
  - 4) Harmony

- c. Overall . . . . . 30%
  - 1) Stage Presence
  - 2) Stage Presence
  - 3) Stage Presence

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
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3. Pieces may either be original compositions, that is, songs composed expressly for this contest; or existing Philippine air choral arrangements; or compositions newly arranged for this tilt. In any case, as above-mentioned, the OSAI should be given two certified true copies of the pieces.
4. If the piece is original or if it is a new choral arrangement, this should be so stated in the application form.
5. Medley shall not be allowed.
6. Each choral group should submit in brief write up about its piece, in one short paragraph; i.e., the gist of the piece as to what it is all about.

#### AWARDS AND FINALS

1. There shall be separate set of prizes for each sub-division of both collegiate and secondary schools, namely:

##### a. Secondary Schools Division

All-Vocal	All-Female	Mixed Division

##### b. Collegiate Division - same as the above

2. The following special awards in both main divisions shall be given during the grand finale:

- a. Best in Photography
- b. Best in Costume

#### President's "PAGIBIG NG LAKH" Grand Awards

- a. Grand award trophy shall be given to the over-all champion of the Collegiate Division and Secondary Schools Division.

- b. Three awards shall be given Presidentiel trophies which shall stay permanently in a school winning it for three consecutive years. The names of the schools winning the grand awards shall be inscribed on these trophies.


- c. Only the first prize winners are eligible to vie for these awards, based on the following:

- 1) Contest piece performance - 70%
- 2) Novelty performances - 30%

- d. 1967 "PAGIBIG NG LAKH" Presidential awardees are automatically entitled to vie for the national finals provided, however,

they do not compete in the following contest immediately after winning the award.

b) choice of piece (and theme if any)  
representation & blocking

c) costume and hand props  
d) lighting

choice of piece. Consider use of choice of piece whether that is  
folklore or western music was specially composed for the  
work. Theme (which is not compulsory, as a choreography can be  
anywhere but still very imaginative). If there is a theme, this  
must be profound and of plain profound quality. A violent theme  
must be expressed but must be tastefully presented.

b) representation & blocking. Consider musicality, also musical interpretation  
will be intentionally contra-puntal to the music. Consider  
imaginative approach to groupings, roles, or interpretation of the  
(if there is a theme or story).

c) costume & dance, this must be neat and clean and all would be  
well appreciated.

d) costume and use of hand props. They must be imaginative (not  
necessarily expensive) - consider culture, style of costume  
enhances the theme, note overstatement this; if Vietnam is a theme, overstatement  
of costume will displease this. The extra consideration must be given to  
this. THIS must not be overbearing and heavy.

e) lighting. STAGE SETS must be balanced light so that there  
is no contrast or any shade is split second timing by audience for  
performance themselves or the backstage area. They must enhance the  
work but contrary or overshadow this. Lighting must be imaginative  
and must again enhance the work, creating the desired atmosphere.  
and overstatement just displease the "dislike" overstatement will  
definitely creep into many productions --- choreographers are best  
to begin achieve true thought among young people and not the  
powerful type of entertainment.
