WORLD FOOD DAY '83 CELEBRATION IN THE SCHOOLS

1. World Food Day, pursuant to Proclamation No. 2120 dated September 22, 1982 issued by His Excellency, President Ferdinand E. Marcos, will be celebrated annually every October 16.
2. The annual observance of World Food Day in the schools endeavors to generate an increased awareness of all sectors of the population, particularly in the schools, regardless of age or cultural background, on the problems and issues on food, nutrition, health and agriculture.
3. World Food Day '83 in the schools will be a nationwide celebration and will highlight suggested activities listed in the in the inclosure to this Memorandum.
4. Schools superintendents and heads of schools, colleges and universities are hereby enjoined to arrange and coordinate programs/projects, contests, convocations and celebrations to commemorate World Food Day '83.
5. School heads, administrators and schools superintendents are directed to submit a report on the activities/projects/programs held to mark this year's celebration to their respective regional directors, who shall in turn include this in their respective regular reports submitted to this Office.
6. Immediate and wide dissemination of this Memorandum to all concerned is desired.
