GUIDELINES FOR LOAN APPLICATION PROCEDURES UNDER  
THE "STUDY NOW PAY LATER PLAN" FOR SY 1984-85

To: Bureau Directors  
Regional Directors  
School Superintendents  
Presidents, State Colleges and Universities  
Heads of Private Schools, Colleges and Universities

1. For the information and guidance of all concerned, the following schedule and guidelines for the interview of applicants and the filing and processing of their application forms under the Educational Assistance Act of 1976, otherwise known as the "Study Now Pay Later Plan", for the school year 1984-85 are hereby disseminated:

- a. Publicity period from January 1 to March 31, 1984;
- b. Submission of the list of the upper 1% of the graduating students duly certified by the high school principal to the schools superintendents on or before March 15, 1984;
- c. Schedule of interview of applicants and processing of their paper, March 20 to May 2, 1984 (See Inclosure No. 1);
- d. Submission of masterlist of selected applicants to the National Educational Loan Assistance Center, Ministry of Education, Culture and Sports by city/provincial school divisions, vocational and technical schools, through the regional offices on or before May 15, 1984;
- e. Processing and approval of loan applications of the selected applicants by the lending institutions from May 29 to July 15, 1984; and
- f. Special projects as agreed upon.

2. Strict compliance with Department Order No. 31, s. 1976, "Policy on Planned Growth of Student Population in Metro Manila" and with the regulation that student loan grantees shall study in their respective cities/provinces/regions and to take priority courses recommended for their region is desired.







3. It is requested that all members of the screening and processing committee strictly follow the schedule and inclosed guidelines in the screening of applicants. The rule that no two members of a family should be recipients of the Study Now Pay Later Plan should be adhered to.

4. Furthermore, secondary school principals are requested to submit on or before March 15, 1984 the list of the upper 15% of the graduating students to the schools superintendents to enable the screening/processing committee to process all qualified applicants. Strict compliance is requested with the deadline for the submission of masterlist of the qualified applicants and non-qualified applicants as ranked by the screening committee. It is also urged that the "Study Now Pay Later Plan" and the priority courses (See Inclosure No. 2) assigned to each region during the Career Week of all graduating students be disseminated.

5. All school officials are enjoined to assist in the immediate dissemination of this announcement to all concerned.

REVISED GUIDELINES FOR THE SCREENING/PROCESSING COMMITTEE  
IN THE SELECTION OF THE STUDY NOW PAY LATER PLAN  
APPLICANTS FOR SY 1984-1985

I. ON QUALIFICATIONS OF LGAN APPLICANTS:

- A. Must be a Filipino citizen, single and a resident of the Philippines. (as amended on Feb. 21, 1978)
- B.
  1. Must not be over 21 years of age at the time of application if enrolling in the freshman year of degree course. (as amended on Feb. 21, 1978)
  2. Must not be over 25 years of age at the time of application if already enrolled in a priority course. (as amended on Feb. 21, 1978)
  3. Must not be over 25 years of age at the time of application if enrolling in non-degree course. (as amended on Feb. 21, 1978 and Jan. 22, 1981)
- C. Must enroll or is enrolled in any of the priority courses prescribed in the region he/she belongs. (as amended on Jan. 22, 1978)
- D. Must be in good health as shown by a medical certificate issued by a government physician. (as amended on Feb. 21, 1978)
- E. Must be of good moral character and has not been the subject of any disciplinary action.
- F. Deserving:
  1. If enrolling in degree courses:
    - a. For regular students entering the freshman year: (as amended on Jan. 22, 1981)
      - (1) Must have completed his secondary courses in a public school or in a duly recognized private school in the Philippines and must belong to the upper 15% of his entire graduating class. (as amended on Feb. 21, 1978)







- (2) Must have obtained an NCEE score with a general average percentile rank of at least 85% and must have a general average of not less than 82% for his fourth year high school (as amended on Feb. 21, 1978)
- b. For accredited students entering the freshman year: (additional item as approved on Jan. 22, 1981)
  - (1) Must have obtained a general weighted average of 82% and fourth year level equivalent in all the categorized subjects under the P.E.F.I. (additional item as approved on Jan. 22, 1981)
  - (2) Must have obtained an NCEE score with a general average percentile rank of at least 85%. (additional item as approved on Jan. 22, 1981)
- c. If already enrolled in a priority degree course:
  - (1) Must not have failed in any subject in the semester last attended preceding the application for a loan. (as amended on Jan. 22, 1981)
  - (2) Must have obtained a weighted average of at least "2.50" or its equivalent in the semester last attended preceding the application for a loan. (as amended on Feb. 21, 1978 and Jan. 22, 1981)
- d. For all entering the freshman year or already enrolled in a priority course:
 

Must not have obtained grades not lower than 80% in Chemistry, Mathematics and Physics for those taking Engineering and Natural Science courses

2. If enrolling in non-degree courses:

- a. For regular students entering the freshman year: (additional item as approved on Jan. 22, 1981)









(1) Must have completed his secondary course in a duly recognized public or private school in the Philippines (as amended on Feb. 21, 1978)

(2) Must have obtained a general average of not lower than 80% in his fourth year high school subjects (as amended on Feb. 21, 1978)

b. For accredited students entering the freshman year: (additional item as approved on Jan. 22, 1981)

Must have obtained a general weighted average of 80% and fourth year level equivalent in all the categorized subjects under the P.F.P.T. (additional item as approved on Jan. 22, 1981)

c. If already enrolled in a priority non-degree course: (additional item as approved on Jan. 22, 1981)

(1) Must not have failed in any subject in the semester last attended preceding the application for a loan. (additional item as approved on Jan. 22, 1981)

(2) Must have obtained a weighted average of at least "2.50" or its equivalent in the semester last attended preceding the application for a loan. (additional item as approved on Jan. 22, 1981)

G. Poor:

1. Must be a dependent (son/daughter) of parents or guardian with a gross income of not more than fifteen thousand pesos (P15,000.00) per annum. (as amended on Jan. 22, 1981)

2. Must not be enjoying a government or private scholarship grant or receiving any grants-in-aid for his studies from any source which provide free tuition fees, books, personal and living allowances at the time of application. (as amended on Feb. 9, 1977 and Jan. 22, 1981)







F. There shall be only one grantee per family in any school year.

## II. SYSTEM OF DETERMINING PRIORITIES:

A system of priorities for awards of loan grants is based primarily on the degree of need for assistance and potentials for successful completion of the selected priority course of the applicant. Thus, the brightest of the very poor shall have higher priority for a loan grant than one who may be equally poor but less bright; than one equally bright but relatively not so poor.

The Point System used for determining priorities must be followed strictly.

## III. SUBMISSION OF MASTER LIST OF RECOMMENDED APPLICANTS:

The Screening and Processing Committee shall submit to the NPLAC the masterlist of recommended applicants on or before the deadline specified by the NPLAC. Late submission of the masterlist will not be accepted and slots allocated will be considered unused. These will be reallocated to other school divisions.

## IV. POST SCREENING ACTIVITY:

The Screening Committee must meet the approved SNPLP applicants and discuss with them the following:

1. Choice of course/school
2. Conditions of assistance
3. Job placements
4. Repayments of loan









V. LOAN APPLICATION SHALL BE ACCOMPANIED BY THE FOLLOWING SUPPORTING DOCUMENTS

1. Birth Certificate of the applicant issued by the local Civil Registrar.
2. Latest copy of the parent's/guardian's Income Tax Return.
3. Medical Certificate issued by a government physician certifying the applicant's physical fitness to study.
4. Certification that the applicant is not enjoying any government or private scholarship signed by parent/guardian.
5. Certification by parent/guardian that no one in the family other than the applicant is availing or had availed of the SNPIP.
6. Latest copy of the Residence Certificate of both applicant and parent/guardian.
7. Affidavit of guardianship if the applicant is under the custody of a guardian.
8. Certification signed by the school principal/registrar/dean attesting that the applicant possesses good moral character (for entering freshmen and non-freshmen in both degree and non-degree priority courses).
9. High School Report Card (Form 138) or Transcript of Record (for regular students enrolling as freshmen in both degree and non-degree priority courses).
10. Copy of NCHB Result (for both regular and accredited students entering as freshmen in the degree courses).
11. Copy of NETC, MECs Certificate of Accreditation and Equivalency Rating (for accredited students enrolling as freshmen in both degree and non-degree priority courses).
12. Official Report of Rating or Certification of grades for the last semester attended by the applicant issued by the school registrar/dean (for those already enrolled in a priority course).
13. Certification by the school principal/director that the applicant belongs to the upper 15% of his graduating class (for regular student enrolling as freshmen in degree course).
14. Certification issued by the Barangay Chairman as to the applicant's residence and good moral character (for those who are out of school for more than a year).

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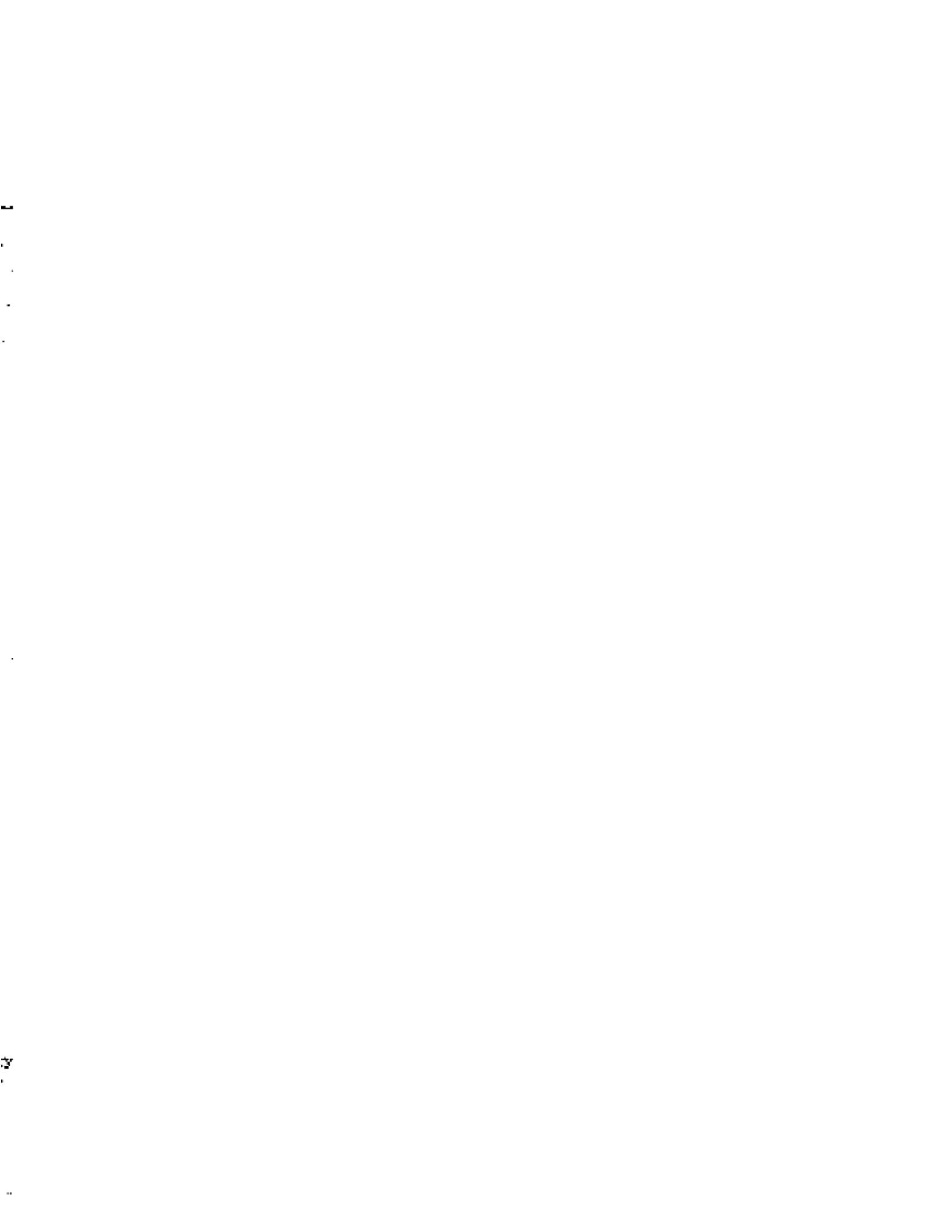
