SUMMER CLASSES FOR TEACHERS OF WORK EDUCATION

To: Bureau Directors
Regional Directors
School Superintendents

1. Summer classes for teachers of work education—industrial arts, practical arts and home industries and crafts, and food service for teachers of home economics, food trades and homemaking will be conducted at the Home Industries Training Center, Corner Ayala Boulevard and San Marcelino Street, Manila and at the Food Service Training Laboratory, IESG Compound, Aurora St., Makati, respectively, from April 13 to May 31, 1984.

2. The following courses will be offered:

a. Home Industries Training Center

Product Design	Hand Loom Weaving
Ceramics	Cupiz and Wood Lamination
Coco-Sis Shells Craft	Macrame Crafts
Crocheting	Fiber Crafts (Micro)
Dressmaking	Leather Craft
Drapery

b. Food Service Training Laboratory

Catering Management
Quantity Cooking
Baking
Cake Decoration

3. A. Licenses for the summer courses are expected to observe the following:

- a. Provide themselves with supplies and materials needed in the course;
- b. Enroll in courses that involve the use of materials available in their communities or which have relevance to their communities as well as in schools;

- c. Allowing training sessions which are conducted on a whole day basis, except for teachers enrolled in teacher-training institutions, who may attend either the morning or afternoon sessions **only**.
 - d. Teachers enrolled in Cafeteria Management should bring white uniform with any style/cut and flat shoes;
 - e. The nature of training is largely practical;
 - f. A certificate of attendance indicating the number of hours actually attended is issued at the end of the training; and
 - g. Teachers who will undergo training from out-of-school funds have to stay in the same school for at least two years so she can train all Cafeteria and Parlor waiters in the school.
4. Applications for registration for the course, by mail, or in person at the DCS Industries Training Office at the above address, shall include a sum of thirty pesos (P30) shall be charged for each training HITC courses and fifty pesos (P50) for each course in Food Service Training. These applications by mail should send their application to reach the Director not later than one month before classes.
5. The teachers in attendance for summer classes are entitled to traveling expenses, board and lodging payable from local school funds, subject to availability of funds and the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations.
