21ST ANNUAL YMCA-BIZEL YOUTH LEADERSHIP TRAINING INSTITUTE

1. The YMCA of the Philippines will hold its 21st Annual YMCA-Bizel Youth Leadership Institute on May 16-19, 1984, at the Scala Retreat House, Sacoiod City. The theme is "Imperatives of Ideology in Leadership."

2. This annual event calls for the involvement of students in the youth sector for the purpose of developing conviction and adherence to the ideals and principles of excellence, honesty, integrity, and love of country in the belief that these students would be the future leaders of the nation.

3. All schools, colleges and universities, both public and private, are enjoined to encourage their students to participate in the training institute by availing themselves of the offered scholarships.

4. The salient features and other pertinent details of the scholarship program are found in the enclosed literature or course description and the Program Content Plan.

5. Applicants for scholarship under this program, using the enclosed form, should file their applications with any of the following:
a) Universities and Colleges; b) Local YMCA's; and c) Civic Organizations on or before the end of February, 1984.

6. It is desired that the contents of this Memorandum be immediately disseminated and given the widest publicity possible for the information and guidance of all concerned.

21ST ANNUAL YOUTH LEADERSHIP TRAINING INSTITUTE

General Information and Guidelines

1. Venue : Seale Retreat House
Bacolod City

2. Period : May 14 - 21, 1984

3. Theme : "Imperatives of Ideology in Leadership"

4. Minimum Qualifying Requirements

- 4.1. Must be an honorable undergraduate student for the school year 1983-1984 with a weighted average of 2.0 or its equivalent for the past four (4) semesters, and without failing grade in any subject.
- 4.2. Must be able to express himself clearly and accurately in verbal and written communication.
- 4.3. Must have leadership experience as President in high school or college or as organizer in school and/or community and officer of one major organization and/or community.
- 4.4. Must have attended and participated in at least one (1) leadership training and spearheaded one project in school and/or community.
- 4.5. Above mentioned minimum requirements shall be applicable to partial scholars. In the case of nominees for full scholarship, anything above the minimum requirements shall be a plus factor.
- 4.6. Must be able to secure ways of defraining travel expenses to and from the Institute venue. This can be done either by solicitation from several sources or sponsorship from nominating organization.

5. Types of Scholarships Available

- 5.1. Full Scholarship - There are thirty-five (35) slots available.
- 5.2. Partial Scholarship - There are ten (10) slots available. Partial scholars shall pay a Registration Fee of One Thousand Five Hundred Pesos (\$1,500.00) to be paid by the interested individual and his sponsor by private, public or civic organizations. After notice of acceptance is received, Registration Fees should be forwarded to the Foundation on or before May 6, 1984.

6. Privileges for Scholars

- 6.1. Board and Lodging at the Institute venue for the whole duration of the Institute
- 6.2. Seminar Kit
- 6.3. For scholars coming from South Luzon and North Luzon, stop-over lodgings at the YMCA International Hostel on the evening of May 14, 1984 and on the evening of June 1, 1984.
- 6.4. Accident Insurance
- 6.5. Full scholars shall receive a partial travel subsidy (See attached schedule)

7. Recruiting Process

To insure quality scholars and preparedness for the advance intensive leadership training, the following recruitment guidelines are to be implemented:

- 7.1. There shall be three (3) sources of nomination for scholarships, namely: a) Universities and Colleges, b) Local YMCAs, and c) Civic organizations. These sources shall conduct and administer a thorough screening process of their nominees based on the recommended screening guidelines.
- 7.2. Nominations shall be forwarded to the National Screening Committee (NSC), Rizal Youth Leadership Training Foundation, Inc., 350 Araneta Street, Manila on or before March 5, 1964.
- 7.3. The NSC shall conduct the final screening on March 15-20, 1964.
- 7.4. Notice of scholarship acceptance will be issued beginning March 21, 1964.
- 7.5. Accepted scholars shall confirm and ascertain attendance to the Institute between April 1-5, 1964.
- 7.6. Issuance of advance study materials and additional requirements, April 1-5, 1964.

8. National Screening Criteria

Quantitative

1. Academic Proficiency 30%
2. Proficiency in Communication 20%
3. Leadership Experience 30%
4. Extra-Curricular Activities 20%

Qualitative

1. Interview results indicating strengths and weaknesses of aspirants. This shall also include biological limitations such as allergies, hypertension, and religious prohibitions if any.
2. Completeness of submitted requirements.
3. Certificate of good moral character.

9. Recommended Screening Procedure for the Nominating Institution

a) Evaluate the following:

- a.1. Transcript of Records
- a.2. Curriculum Vitae and Bio Data
- a.3. Written Essay on any topic of interest at least 300 words typewritten, double space, 6 1/2 x 11.

- b) 1-2 copies of resume
- c) Oral Presentation - Debating, oration, extemporaneous speaking, singing, etc.
- d) Signing and encyclopedic of Application Form
- e) Secure Medical Certificate

10. Things to be submitted to the National Screening Committee

- a) Transcript of Records
- b) Weighted average of academic and non-academic grades signed by School Registrar for the past 4 semesters (first year and second year College grades)
- c) Bio Data and Curriculum Vitae
- d) Medical Certificate
- e) Essay
- f) Fully accomplished Application Form

21st YMCA-RIZAL YOUTH LEADERSHIP TRAINING INSTITUTE

In 1961, the Filipino people marked the Centennial of the nation's foremost hero, Dr. José P. Rizal. It was also the 50th Anniversary of the founding of the YMCA of the Philippines. To commemorate both historic events, the YMCA fittingly organized the YMCA-Rizal Youth Leadership Training Institute; firstly, to honor the great Filipino hero whose life and death changed the destiny of the country; and secondly, to mark the Golden Jubilee of the YMCA which had provided tremendous impetus for the character development of the youth, whom Rizal had apostrophized as the "Fair Hope of the Fatherland".

The Institute was aimed at training top college students from various colleges and universities in the Philippines for leadership in honesty, integrity, excellence, and love of country. The belief and conviction was that those students would be the future leaders of the nation.

Today, such conviction is still in the hearts and minds of the leaders behind the Institute.

Every year, the curriculum of the Institute undergo revisions to make it richer in content and process and more important, to make it more responsive to the needs of the youth and the country. It is likewise important that the institute's curriculum is cognizant of and abreast with the changes and developments that are taking shape within the realm of "leadership formation".

In formulating the curriculum of the 21st YMCA-Rizal Youth Leadership Training Institute a number of guiding principles have been considered.

GUIDING PRINCIPLES:

The decade of the 70's and likewise the beginnings of the 80's witness the emergence of changes in all the facets of man's environment. Distinctively, even the pace of change has changed; moreover, the process of change has likewise changed. It is therefore imperative for a leader to look into the process of change - how he can MANAGE THE CHANGE EFFORTS.

A purposeful leadership program, therefore must create venues for the participants to be trained as LEADER/CHANGE AGENT. If this is the case, the training must be wholistic. It is not only necessary for a leader to understand concepts in leadership, he must also be fully aware of his immediate environment, committed and skilled in initiating and managing interventions for its improvement.

A WHOLISTIC LEADERSHIP FORMATION is one where the training targets both cognitive and affective development. It is likewise oriented at developing appropriate skills and the formation of relevant values and attitudes.

There is also a recognition that to be a leader is not through the possession of a set of qualities. A leader has a set of values, knowledge, attitudes and skills for him to EFFECTIVELY ACTIVATE A SET OF BEHAVIORS.

At the skills level, the DEVELOPMENT OF ANALYTICAL and COMMUNICATION SKILLS is primordial. A leader is not only aware, he must be able to think and express his thoughts lucidly.

But the core of all of these, the leader is first and foremost a PERSON. He must therefore, possess a QUALITY OF BEING, which does not see leadership

Finally, all of these must be RESULT ORIENTED and translated into ACTION PLANS to make them truly meaningful.

The theme "Imperatives of Ideology in Leadership" captures the very essence of those principles.

RATIONALE:

The 21st YMCA-Rizal Youth Leadership Training Institute shall transpire for a period of 16 days, under the joint auspices of the YMCA of the Philippines, the Rizal Youth Leadership Training Foundation, Inc. and the Rizal Youth Leadership Training Institute Alumni Association. Forty-five (45) highly qualified young men and women from all over the Philippines, irrespective of nationality or creed will be convened for the purpose of developing conviction and adherence to the ideals and principles of excellence, honesty, integrity, and love of country upon which the YCA was founded and for which Jose R. Rizal lived, labored and died.

GOALS:

The Institute is designed to produce a pool of youth leaders who are actively involved in their own and their peers' development as dynamic individual committed to and skilled in initiating and managing purposive change efforts for the improvement of his environment within the context of the values and principles inherent in a free society.

Specifically, it is envisioned to develop youth leaders who, in their specific spheres of influence, will have the skills and abilities to:

1. MODEL attitudes that affirm persons, as well as
2. GENERATE these in others
3. TURN conflicts into creative problem solving situations,
4. BALANCE personal and organizational objectives,
5. EVOlVE a systematic approach to managing tasks groups,
6. Use a PERPECTIVE of effective leadership behaviors in dealing with human and material resources, and
7. INITIATE and MANAGE purposive change efforts.

METHODOLOGY

The experiential learning method will be used extensively in the Institute. This will be supplemented by relevant readings and theory presentations as needed.

To introduce realism into the formal instruction and to teach by demonstration the infinite variety of goals, problems, facts, conditions, conflicts and personalities which occur in the actual world of affairs the case method shall be utilized.

A method of analyzing causal relations and of building scientific constructs shall be facilitated through structured experience.

Creativity and aesthetic sense shall be encouraged through activities such as Literacy-Musical Events, Newsletter, and Special Features of the Day.

So as not to be dissociated from the usual family atmosphere and also to give the scholars the opportunity to experience Recolded hospitality, the scholars shall be adopted by foster parents to promote an opportunity to share ideas and communicate in the most basic social structure of a family.
