1. The Philippine Guidance and Personnel Association, Inc. (PGPA), a national organization of guidance counselors, will hold a seminar-workshop at Villa Victoria, Davao City, on March 8-11, 1984, with the theme "Enriching Counselor Skills."
  2. The PGPA will focus its professional activities on the following areas: a) Testing Skills Upgrade; b) Family Life Cycle; c) Life Style Analysis; d) Photo Counseling; e) Creative Thinking Approaches; f) Growth Processes; g) Development of Enrichment Programs; and h) Geriatric Counseling.
  3. In view of the importance of the seminar-workshop in upgrading guidance counseling in schools, guidance counselors, coordinators, supervisors, and guidance teachers are hereby encouraged to attend the seminar-workshop.
  4. Fees of ₱300 for PGPA members and ₱350 for non-members will be charged from each participant to cover registration, hand-outs, kits, certificate and journal proceedings. For live-out participant an additional fee of ₱120 will be charged to cover lunch and 2 snacks. For live-in participant an additional fee of ₱360 will be collected to cover lodging, breakfast, 2 snacks, lunch, and supper.
  5. Attendance of participants from the public school sector will be on official time only. Expenses incurred in such attendance are personal. Delegates from private institutions should make their own arrangements with their respective schools.
  6. It is desired that the contents of this Memorandum be disseminated to all concerned.
