SEMINAR-WORKSHOPS ON EDUCATIONAL PLANNING AND MANAGEMENT
FOR SECONDARY EDUCATION PROGRAM

To: Bureau Directors
Regional Directors
Chiefs of Services and Heads of Units
School Superintendents

1. The Ministry of Education, Culture and Sports, in collaboration with the Seameo Regional INNOTECH Center, will hold a series of two live-in national seminar-workshops on educational planning and management for the secondary education sector officials at the INNOTECH in Quezon City. The first session will be held from April 24 to May 5 for the regions located in the Visayas and Mindanao while the second group will be held from May 15 to May 25 for the regions located in Luzon.

2. The general objectives of the seminar-workshops are:

- a. to assist in establishing a systematic and coordinated approach to the preparation of development plans for the secondary school system;
- b. to strengthen the capability of the secondary school officials to manage their planning operations in the area of secondary education; and
- c. to develop in selected schools a core of secondary school officials who will serve as leaders in educational management and supervision.

The specific objectives are:

- a. to review and revise current regional and institutional plans to ensure congruence with a proposed national development plan for the sector;
- b. to conduct an assessment of the objectives, capabilities and programs of specific schools, particularly in relation to the community, regional and national development;
- c. to set up a coordinated system for the preparation, monitoring and evaluation of the institutional/regional plans, programs and projects;
- d. to consider and plan for alternative educational delivery systems for secondary schools;

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- e. to apply the following management tools in given situations: situational analysis, problem solving, decision-making, projections and performance indicators;
- f. to develop alternative styles of management for performing organizational tasks; and
- g. to appreciate the importance of perceiving one's work as a significant contribution to efficient, effective, and economical delivery of secondary education.

3. The expected outputs/outcomes for these seminar-workshops are as follows:

- a. Revised regional and institutional plans for SY 1965-66 to SY 1969-70 along the new national development guidelines;
- b. Training designs for regional workshops;
- c. Organization of a core of regional and institutional planning teams composed of academic and administrative staff.

4. In these seminar-workshops, each regional team shall be composed of 6 participants, namely: the Assistant Regional Director, Chief, Secondary Education Division; one (1) Assistant Schools Superintendent in charge of secondary education, three (3) subject specialists with specialization other than the majors of the foregoing officials; the Senior Planning Officer, and the Finance Officer.

5. The regional team will, in turn, conduct seminar-workshops for the Secondary Schools Planning Team (SSPT) for 36 schools per region immediately following the national workshop, but not later than June 26, 1964. The SSPT will consist of four: the High School Principal, a Secondary School Head Teacher (SSH), a Secondary School Teacher (SST), and an officer in charge of school finances.

6. The secondary schools will be selected from various types of public and private schools by the Regional Director. It is suggested that the composition of the participating schools will satisfy the following criterions:

- a. The school is located in a place accessible to a good number of secondary schools;
- b. The school officials have the leadership capability to serve in development activities;
- c. Resources for training are available;
- d. The school is representative of the specific type of secondary school to which it belongs. The number of participating schools by type are as follows:

7. The Senior Planning Officers are required to bring copies of the following: the latest secondary school profiles (1983-1984), both the start-of-the-year and end-of-the-year forms, regional five-year development plan (current), as well as the Statistical Bulletin of all divisions in the regions. The Assistant Schools Superintendents will bring the latest copies of their Division Statistical Bulletins, end-of-the-year and start-of-the year forms.

8. Travel expenses and per diems of the regional teams at the national level will be drawn from project funds, subject to the usual accounting and auditing regulations. Travel expenses and per diems of the secondary school teams will be charged against local or institutional funds with a nominal assistance to be granted to the regional offices from project funds.

9. Immediate dissemination and implementation of this Memorandum is desired.
