FIRST NATIONAL SEMINAR-WORKSHOP ON  
THE TEACHING OF ARCHITECTURE

The Bureau of Higher Education, Ministry of Education, Culture and Sports, in coordination with the United Architects of the Philippines (UAP), is holding its First National Seminar-Workshop on the Teaching of Architecture at the Philippine Center for Economic Hostel, U.P. Campus Diliman, Quezon City on May 24-26, 1984.

2. With the theme "Upgrading the Teaching Skills of Architectural Educators," this Seminar-Workshop will have the following objectives:

- a. to gain insights on instructional planning of courses in architecture;
- b. to select and use appropriate teaching methods for the courses;
- c. to apply teaching-learning principals;
- d. to plan and design echo seminars for architecture teachers; and
- e. to provide a general teaching program that will promote national identity, cultural consciousness and leadership skills.

3. Deans/Heads of faculty members of architecture schools/colleges and universities are encouraged to attend this seminar-workshop.

4. Registration fee of P450 will be charged each participant to cover registration, hand-outs, kits, six snacks, three lunches, and certificate of attendance.

5. Attendance of participants from the public school sector will be on official time only. Expenses incurred in such attendance are personal. Delegates from private institutions should make their own arrangements with their respective schools.

6. Immediate dissemination and implementation of the contents of this Memorandum is desired.
