ASSOCIATION OF SOUTHEAST ASIAN INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER LEARNING
(ASAIHL) SEMINAR ON "HIGHER EDUCATION AND THE
LABOR MARKET: THE SOUTHEAST ASIAN EXPERIENCE"

1. The Association of Southeast Asian Institutions of Higher Learning (ASAIHL) will hold a four-day seminar on August 19-22, 1984, at Silahis International Hotel, Manila.
2. With the theme "Higher Education and the Labor Market: the Southeast Asian Experience", individual country reports on this thrust will be shared from Hong Kong, Thailand, Indonesia, Singapore, Malaysia, the Philippines, Australia, Japan and Hawaii.
3. The seminar will also feature the presentation of papers on the following areas:
 - a. Qualitative Considerations in Manpower and Educational Planning (Malaysia)
 - b. Making Vocational-Technical Education Attractive (Hong Kong) and
 - c. Planning Manpower Needs for the Southeast Asian Societies of the Future (Singapore).
4. Foreign delegates from ASAIHL member schools in the region will be in attendance.
5. Philippine colleges and universities are encouraged to send participants to this seminar where experiences of different Southeast Asian countries will be shared and examined, particularly on the relationship between manpower development in higher education and the labor market.

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6. Philippine ASAIHL member institutions will be assessed ₱1,000 per school to help defray seminar expenses. This assessment will entitle each institution to five (5) official delegates. Each additional delegate from member institutions will be charged a registration fee of ₱200 which will cover seminar handouts, snacks and meals.

7. For non-ASAIHL member institutions, a registration fee of ₱50.00 will be charged each participant to cover seminar handouts only. If they wish to be included in the snacks and meals throughout the seminar duration, tickets may be bought from the Seminar Secretariat.

8. Seminar fees and other incidental expenses may be charged against local funds for state colleges and universities, subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules, while expenses of participants representing private schools may be borne by their respective institutions.

9. Inclosed is a copy of the Program of Activities for the Seminar.

10. It is requested that this Memorandum be given the widest dissemination among all those concerned.
