MEMORANDUM
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NATIONAL SCIENCE CLUB MONTH CELEBRATION FOR SY 1981

To: Bureau Directors
Regional Directors
School Superintendents
Presidents, State Colleges and Universities
Heads of Private Schools, Colleges and Universities
Vocational School Superintendents/Administrators

1. Inclosed is the schedule of activities for the 1981 National Science Club Month Celebration, to be observed in September conformably to Presidential Proclamation No. 1895 dated September 4, 1979. As in past years, SPI-NSTA will sponsor two activities in coordination with the NECS. This year's general theme is: Productivity and Self-Reliance thru Science and Technology: The Science Club Way.

2. The activities are designed to promote and develop science and technology consciousness among the youth and the general public through the organization and mobilization of science clubs in schools, colleges and universities. Focus of weekly activities will be as follows:

First Week - Science Clubs in Service of
The Community

Second Week - Enhancement of Science-Math
Education

Third Week - Manpower Development: The
Science Club Way (For Science
Club Members)

Fourth Week - Manpower Development: The
Science Club Way (For Science
Club Managers) and Recognition
Rites for Science Club Movement

3. These activities are intended to support the science and mathematics programs of the Ministry of Education, Culture and Sports and the development of aesthetic and social values of the young. The participation of school pupils and students in these activities is basically voluntary in nature. The cooperation of all concerned is earnestly requested to insure the successful conduct of the activities. Care should be exercised however, in undertaking such activities to avoid undue disruption of, or interference with, the regular school program.

4. Details of implementation of these activities at each level will be worked out by representatives of the National Science and Technology Authority/Science Promotion Institute (NSTA/SPI) and school officials and teachers concerned at their respective levels.

5. Expenses of official participants in optional activities indicated in the enclosure to this Memorandum shall be charged against NSTA/SPI funds. No funding assistance from NSTA will be given for regional and local activities. Attendance of Science/ Math Division/ Regional Supervisors, SOAAP Task Area, component implementors, all or officials, UNESCO representatives, teachers and others in the various NSTA scheduled activities shall, however, be chargeable to local funds, subject to availability of funds and the usual auditing rules and regulations.

6. Immediate dissemination of this Memorandum is desired.
