CERTIFICATE OF PHYSICAL EDUCATION (CPE) SCHOLARSHIP
FOR ELEMENTARY SCHOOL TEACHERS

To: Regional Directors
Schools Superintendents
Presidents, State Colleges and Universities
Heads of Private Schools, Colleges and Universities
Vocational School Superintendents/Administrators

1. In line with the on-going program of the administration to update the teaching competencies of physical education teachers throughout the country, and to give greater impetus to the sports development program, the Ministry of Education, Culture and Sports, is announcing a partial scholarship grant for deserving elementary school teachers who wish to acquire a Certificate of Physical Education (CPE), beginning this summer 1985.

2. Such scholarship shall be available to ten (10) elementary school teachers from each of the thirteen (13) regions, and it shall be enjoyed until the teacher has completed the C.P.E. Course of 40 units spread over four regular terms at the Marcos Sports Academy, Kabataang Barangay Sports Complex, Marcos Avenue, Quezon City. A teacher grantee shall receive an amount of P1,000.00 for each term to cover the payment of school fees and other expenses basically needed in the pursuit of his studies.

3. To qualify for this MECS Program a teacher should meet the following requirements:

- a. BSEFD or a holder of a Bachelor's degree who satisfies the professional education courses mentioned in the attached Requirements Sheet.
- b. He must be willing to remain as a P.E. Teacher, Instructor, or P.E. Lecture Administrator for five years with his school/region.
- c. He must not be more than forty (40) years old at the start of the grant and he must be physically fit to undergo the physical training demanded by the course. He must be a teacher of good moral character, dedicated and loyal to the service.
- d. He must be strongly recommended by his schools superintendent with the concurrence of the Regional Director.

Wide dissemination of this Memorandum is desired.
