SEMINAR-WORKSHOP ON AGRARIAN REFORM FOR EDUCATORS

To: Bureau Directors  
Regional Directors  
Schools Superintendents  
Presidents, State Colleges and Universities  
Heads of Private Schools, Colleges and Universities

1. The Ministry of Agrarian Reform, with the cooperation of the Ministry of Education, Culture and Sports, will sponsor a summer course in the form of a seminar-workshop on agrarian reform for educators. Through the understanding of the philosophy, concepts and processes of agrarian reform as a strategy for national development, these educators can become more effective instruments to hasten the development process.

2. This summer course will be offered in the following venues: Isabela Colleges, Cauayan, Isabela; Philippine Normal College, Manila; Leyte State College, Tacloban City; and Sicol University, Legazpi City.

3. The specific objectives are to: a) deepen the educator's knowledge and understanding of the philosophy, concepts and practices of the agrarian reform program in the Philippines; b) internalize and appreciate the present program of implementation in the light of current problems and issues; and c) operationalize this knowledge and provide continuity to the enrichment of the curriculum through the preparation of supplementary agrarian reform materials in workshop sessions.

4. The program of study includes a sequence of topics to be handled by experts from the Ministries of Education, Culture and Sports, Agrarian Reform, Agriculture, and Agrarian Reform Institute, Land Bank of the Philippines, National Congress of Farmers' Organizations, etc.; the use of relevant audio-visual instructional materials, analysis of case studies on agrarian reform; field trips to agrarian reform areas and other curriculum enrichment activities.

5. For details of the course, interested parties may contact any of the institutions mentioned in paragraph 2, which will serve as venues of the seminar. Teachers/educators who wish to attend the seminar but are not enrolled in any of these institutions may do so provided that seminar fees, board and lodging, transportation and other expenses incidental to attendance in the seminar will be borne by them. However, those enrolled in these institutions may attend the seminar with special payment of registration fee. They are not entitled to traveling and other incidental expenses considering that they had enrolled on their own in that institution for the summer.

Students eligible for graduate studies may earn the equivalent of 2 or 3 units of credit, depending on the institutions' policies of accreditation, for attendance and completion of seminar requirements, certification of which will be issued by the institutions concerned. Participants who do not wish to pursue graduate studies will receive the Certificate of Participation.
7. Travel expenses, per diem and allowances of the MAR-MECS curriculum consultants who will serve as resource speakers in the seminar shall be charged against the Fund for Agrarian Reform Education (FARE) of the Ministry of Agrarian Reform.
8. Immediate dissemination of this Memorandum is desired.
