NATIONAL WORKSHOP FOR REGIONAL TRAINERS' TEAM IN SELECTED  
RELEVANT SELF-RELIANCE TECHNOLOGY INTEGRATED  
WITH LITERACY PROGRAM

To: Bureau Directors  
Regional Directors  
Schools Superintendents  
Presidents, State Colleges and Universities  
Presidents, Vocational Colleges and Universities

1. The Philippine Association of Nonformal/Community Adult Educators, in cooperation with the Ministry of Education, Culture and Sports and the Asian-South Pacific Bureau of Adult Education (ASPBAE), Region 3, will sponsor a national workshop for Regional Trainers' Team composed of one assistant superintendent, one division nonformal supervisor in charge of nonformal education, two district nonformal education coordinators (elementary) and one nonformal education coordinator (secondary) in selected relevant self-reliance technologies integrated with literacy program from April 29 to May 4, 1985 at the P. Gomez Elementary School, Manila.

2. It is expected that at the end of the five day workshop, the participants shall be able:

- a. to develop further skills in selected relevant technology which will be most useful in the community;
- b. to be able to integrate these skills with the literacy program of the region; and
- c. to produce literacy modules integrated with technology skills.

3. Among the identified relevant technology which should be transferred to the barangay level are:

- a) non-traditional sources of energy specially solar energy;
- b) recycling of waste materials focusing on biogas and fertilizer technology; and
- c) herbal medicine focusing on primary health care.







4. Each region will send a team of five members specified above who can serve as multiplying agents in the transfer of selected relevant self-reliance technology on the barangay level and can write modules integrating literacy in technology teaching.

5. Delegates will attend on official time with ASPBAE providing free snacks and lunch, transportation from station and back, as well as during field trips. A minimal registration fee of one hundred fifty pesos (P150) will be charged by the Association for hand-outs and other conference materials and expenses chargeable against local funds, subject to the usual accounting and auditing procedures.

6. It is expected that delegates will bring with them data on on-going self-reliant projects for monitoring by the Bureau of Continuing Education. Likewise, a listing of medicinal plants available and commonly used in the community for the primary health program will be appreciated.

7. Private colleges and universities may also send their representatives on a first come first served basis.

8. Widest dissemination of this seminar-workshop is enjoined. Inclosed is a skeletal program of day to day activities.
