NATIONAL SCHOLARSHIP AND STUDY GRANT EXAMINATIONS
FOR SCHOOL YEAR 1986-1987

To: Bureau Directors
Regional Directors
Chief of Service and Heads of Units/Centers
School Superintendents
Presidents, State Colleges and Universities
Heads of Private Schools, Colleges and Universities

1. The National Scholarship and Student Loan Center, in coordination with the National Educational Testing Center, this Ministry, announces the forthcoming scholarship and study grant examinations on December 10, 1985.
2. Specifically, the examinations are open to qualified applicants for scholarship/study grants under the following programs:

State Scholarship Program (SSP)
National Integration Study Grant Program (NISGP)
Selected Ethnic Groups Educational Assistance
Program (SEGEAP)
3. All provincial and city school division offices shall maximize the distribution of application forms (Inclosure No. 1) to heads of schools which have qualified applicants per result of local screening made, following the criteria per program as embodied in Inclosure No. 2.
4. Heads of private and state schools may avail of application forms from the NSSLC provided the result of high school screening is coured through the corresponding division offices in order to effectively synchronize the details of screening, most especially the timetable and elicment of test materials.
5. Qualified applicants to the examinations shall be charged a fee of P25.00 regardless of the number of programs applied for. The fees collected, which should tally with the consolidated list of applicants following the format of Inclosure No. 3, shall be remitted by the division offices in cash to the NSSLC which, in turn, shall deposit the amount with the Bureau of Treasury. Remittances in the form of PNB demand drafts or postal money orders are acceptable provided payments are properly addressed to:

6. The day before the examination, MECS Central Office officials shall brief the selected examiners and proctors, each pre-assigned to thirty (30) examinees per room in the same test centers used the previous year.

7. All prospective scholars/study grantees for school year 1986-1987 should be directed to enrol preferably in DHE-indorsed state schools and/or other institutions the NSSLIC may deem appropriate; in FAAP-accredited and other priority programs/courses per Inclosure No. 6.

8. It is desired that school principals, district supervisors, guidance coordinators, and others concerned cooperate in the immediate and nationwide dissemination of this information in order to reach out to the most deserving students and that the timetable (Inclosure No. 4) be strictly adhered to.

9. It is further urged that Inclosure Nos. 1, 3 and 5 be properly accomplished and authentic supporting documents relative to Inclosure No. 2 be submitted to expedite issuance of scholarship/study grant awards.



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GUIDELINES ON THE SELECTION OF QUALIFIED APPLICANTS

A. Qualification Requirements

Filipino citizens who are in good health, have good moral character, whose parents'/court-appointed guardian's gross income in 1984 does not exceed ₱50,000.00 and, in addition, should meet the following requirements before they could qualify for the program as specified:

1. State Scholarship Program (SSP)

- 1.1 Top ten of the current fourth year class
- 1.2 21 years or younger

2. National Integration Study Grant Program (NISGP) and Selected Ethnic Groups Educational Assistance Program (SEGEAP)

- 2.1 Top 15% of the graduating class, excluding non-members of the cultural communities.
- 2.2 Members of cultural communities
 - 2.2.1 Muslim and non-Muslim tribes for NISGP
 - 2.2.2 Hill tribes for SEGEAP
- 2.3 Brother/sister enjoying NSSLC-administered scholarship and study grants not exceeding two per family
- 2.4 25 years or younger

3. Selected Ethnic Groups Educational Assistance Program (SEGEAP) Secondary Level

- 3.1 Top 5% of the current grade six class
- 3.2 Members of selected hill tribes as specified in C

C. Documents Required

To support the qualification requirements in A, the screening committees are advised to require applicants to submit the following authentic supporting documents pertinent to the program applied for:

1. Properly accomplished and processed application form.
2. Certification as to rank in class and one's good moral character following upper portion of Inclosure No. 5.
3. Filer's copy of the 1984 BIR Income Tax Return of applicant's parents'/or court-appointed guardian, in case the former are deceased.
 - 3.1 BIR certification under oath in case both or one of the parents or court-appointed guardian of applicant, whether employed or not is/are exempted from filing ITR stating the reason/s for such exemption.
 - 3.2 Death certificate or affidavit of death of parents in case of orphan applicant and affidavit of support executed by court-appointed guardian.
4. Certification of Tribe Membership (CTM) in cultural communities duly issued by the Office of Muslim Affairs and Cultural Communities (OMACC).

Bona fide members of cultural communities are qualified to participate in the study grant program for the collegiate level, however, only the following hill tribes are open for the SEGEAP (Secondary Level):

Agta, Bukidnon, Buhid, Dumagat, Iraya, Sulod, Ate-Natigsalog, Katagnon, Remontado, Tegaydan, Tadyawan, Tala-andig, Talaingod, Tagbanua, T'boli, and Tiruray




