POST GRADUATE COURSE IN SCHOOL HEALTH NURSING

To: Regional Directors
Schools Superintendents
Presidents, State Colleges and Universities
Heads of Private Schools, Colleges and Universities
Vocational School Superintendents/Administrators

1. A masteral degree program major in School Health Nursing is now offered in the College of Nursing, University of the Philippines, Manila, beginning the school year 1985-1986. The program aims to prepare qualified nurses for the school health nurse practitioner and leadership roles in an educational setting.
2. The Masteral School Health Nurses must meet the criteria set by the MECS Integrated Scholarship Committee and the requirements of the University of the Philippines. Applications, together with the pertinent documents required, must be submitted to the Ministry not later than January 30 of every year, attention: the School Health and Nutrition Center (SEHC), MECS, Manila.
3. In line, therefore, with the Staff Development Program of this Ministry, this program shall be made available to qualified nurses, who shall be entitled to the privileges as specified in paragraph 9 of MECS Memorandum No. 16, s. 1985.
4. It is requested that this Memorandum be disseminated to all concerned.

1985 UNITED NATIONS WEEK OBSERVANCE

To: Bureau Directors
Regional Directors
Schools Superintendents
Presidents, State Colleges and Universities
Heads of Private Schools, Colleges and Universities
Vocational Schools Superintendents/Administrators

1. The United Nations Information Center for the Philippines, in collaboration with the United Nations Association of the Philippines and the Ministry of Education, Culture and Sports, will coordinate the 1985-1986 United Nations Week Observance.

2. Specifically, the UN General Assembly proclaimed 1985 as International Youth Year (IYY) with the theme: Participation, Development and Peace.

3. Inasmuch as United Nations Week this year falls from October 17 to 24, it is suggested that the day-to-day activities during the week be related to the theme for the IYY, as follows:

October 17 - Thursday	- Children and Youth for World Peace
October 18 - Friday	- Science and Technology for Peace
October 19 - Saturday	- Women for Peace
October 20 - Sunday	- Prayers and Music for Peace
October 21 - Monday	- Equality and Development for Peace
October 22 - Tuesday	- The UN in Action for World Peace
October 23 - Wednesday	- Reflections on the Projections of UN Objectives in Art
October 24 - Thursday	- Salute to the UN on Its 40th Anniversary

4. All schools, colleges and universities, particularly institutions participating in the National Federation of UNESCO Clubs and Associated Schools project on education for international understanding, cooperation and peace, are strongly urged to take the leadership in initiating various related activities during the UN week.

5. The following suggested activities may be made more innovative and interesting by teachers through their resourcefulness and ingenuity:

- Poster making or painting contests on the theme for IYY;
- Essay or theme writing competitions on how to expand youth participation at national, regional or local levels, publishing the results in local newspapers;
- Exhibits on the theme showing drawings, paintings and other finished articles prepared by children or youth;

- Holding discussions on how to increase youth employment and eliminate discriminatory employment conditions;
- Holding discussions on how the government is helping the out-of-school youth to ensure access to education, technical and vocational training for employment purposes;
- Devoting lesson focused on the concerns and roles of young women in development;
- Organizing intersectoral community-based activities for health education, nutrition, family planning and other welfare services for children and youth to facilitate self-care;
- Holding international convocation programs showing puppet shows, music festival of songs and dances from all over the world.
- Holding a costume party or parade related to the theme where children and youth dress and eat like children of other parts of the world.

6. Cooperation with government and non-government agencies in the community will contribute to a more successful observance.

7. Reports on salient activities undertaken during the celebration including photographs should reach the Office of the Minister of Education, Culture and Sports, Intramuros, Manila, attention: Executive Secretary, United Nations Association of the Philippines, Bureau of Higher Education on or before December 31, 1985 so that these could be published in United Nations or UNESCO materials in Paris, New York or Geneva.

8. All school authorities concerned are urged to extend full cooperation and support to this year's celebration to insure its success.
