1. The U.P. Musical Arts and Research Management Foundation, Inc., in cooperation with the U.P. College of Music, will conduct its yearly summer courses under the Continuing Education Music Program for Teachers all over the country to be held at the Abelardo Hall, U.P. College of Music, Diliman, Quezon City, from April 20 to May 29, 1987.
2. The program seeks to provide music competence and a revitalization of techniques of pedagogy to teachers engaged in elementary and secondary school music teaching.
3. The program is open to regional and division music supervisors and music teachers. Tuition fees, travel, living, and other expenses are to be borne by participants.
4. In view of the significance of this project to our music teachers in public and private schools, the regions are encouraged to participate in this program. Enclosed is the description of courses. Applications and/or inquiries may be sent to the addressees found at the back of the inclosure.

CONTINUING EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS

The Program of Continuing Education for Music Teachers, Professors, Musicians and Laymen consist of short-term non-degree courses in various aspects of music and music education. It is designed to meet the developmental needs of individuals engaged in the following areas of activities:

1. Classroom teaching at the pre-primary, elementary and high school and related knowledge of text materials and revitalization of skills and capabilities of performers.
2. Choral conducting in schools and semi-professional ensembles
3. Composition and arranging
4. Theory.

Some courses are also intended to benefit the non-professional musicians or music enthusiasts who simply interested in learning more about music.

There will be no tuition fees in the entire program. (staggered schedule) Participants must be provide music competence and musicality to themselves and will care for their respective transportation expenses. A Certificate of Attendance will also be given upon completion of course.

Registration and payment of fees is done one day before the first session of the course. However, in some classes where the number of students for the first session is attained. In some others, registration may be staggered to start.

All sessions will be held in the Alabado Hall, U.P. College of Music.

1. **Objectives:** To introduce children to the basic elements of music, to develop their ability to sing, to play instruments, and to appreciate the sounds made by others.

2. **Materials:** Instruments such as drums, bells, xylophones, and recorders; musical notation books; tape recordings of various styles of music; and a variety of objects that can be used to make sounds.

3. **Activities:** Children will participate in group singing, playing instruments, and listening to tapes. They will also have opportunities to create their own music using various materials.

4. **Evaluation:** Children will be evaluated based on their participation in activities, their ability to follow directions, and their overall enjoyment of the music program.

5. **Assessment:** Children will be assessed on their ability to identify different types of music, to recognize different instruments, and to demonstrate their own musical abilities.

6. **Conclusion:** The music program will conclude with a final performance or presentation for the classroom teacher.

#### Workshop I, II, III, IV (Technical Lessons)

#### World Approaches


An introductory course in world appreciation that includes the study and interpretation of musical cultures. Countries, literature and philosophy of music of different types, forms and styles.
