1987 SEARCH FOR OUTSTANDING SCHOOL-BASED COMMUNITY-CREATED
DRUG ABUSE PREVENTION AND CONTROL PROGRAM

To: Bureau Directors
Regional Directors
School Superintendents
Presidents State Colleges and Universities
Vocational School Superintendents/Administrators

1. There will be a 1987 Search for the Most Outstanding School-Based Community-Oriented Drug Abuse Prevention and Control Program to be conducted from June to October. Its purpose is to assess the impact, effectiveness and efficiency of the Drug Abuse Prevention and Control Program.

2. The regions involved are Regions I, II, III, IV, V, VI, VII, VIII, IX, X, XI, and National Capital Region where the Intensified School-Based Community-Oriented Drug Abuse Prevention and Control Program is being implemented. A preliminary evaluation will be conducted at two levels:

- a. Division level - The Search will be conducted at the division level from June to July by the Division Evaluating Team. Each division will have one district for its entry. All schools in that district will implement the program.
- b. Regional level - The Search at the regional level will be done the whole month of August. The name of the regional winner in the intensified School-Based Community-Oriented Drug Abuse Prevention and Control Program shall be submitted to the Project Officer, DECS-DEB Special Project, 5th Floor, Palacio del Gobernador, Intramuros, Manila on or before August 31.

3. Inclosed are the guidelines, criteria and implementing rules for the Search for the Outstanding School-Community Drug Abuse Prevention and Control Program which will be strictly followed.

4. A National Evaluating Team composed of members of the National Task Force will go around to evaluate the entries of the different regions starting on September 1.

5. Winners of the national contest shall be announced during the celebration of the Drug Abuse Prevention and Control Week on the third week of November.

6. Wide dissemination and compliance with this Memorandum is desired.

II. IMPLEMENTING RULES

1. The Search for the Three Outstanding School-Community Drug Abuse Prevention and Control Projects is open to Regions I, II, III, IV, V, VI, VII, VIII, IX, X, XI and National Capital Region (NCR).
2. The national winners will be decided by a National Evaluating Team composed of the members of the Inter-Agency Council based on the following:
 - a. Results of an ocular inspection/evaluation of the winning School-Community Drug Abuse Prevention and Control Project in the region.
 - b. Interview of randomly selected officials, parents, youths, other clientele in the winning entry.
 - c. Quarterly reports (supported with documents, pictures) submitted by the division coordinators/trainers duly attested by the Schools Superintendent, the Regional Director and Regional Coordinator-Trainors.
 - d. Assessment (if any) by the division/regional monitoring team on its routine visit to the field.
3. Regional coordinators should submit their winning entry on or before August 31, 1987. Entries with accompanying documents and pictures should be submitted to the Office of the Undersecretary, Department of Education, Culture and Sports (DECS), Palacio del Gobernador, Intramuros, Manila. (Attention: Project Officer, DECS-DEP Special Project on Drug Abuse Prevention Education)
4. The timetable for judging the winning entry of each region by the National Evaluation Team is September 1, 1987 to September 10, 1987. Late names of winning regional entries and accompanying documents/pictures should be submitted on or before August 31, 1987 to the Office of the Undersecretary, Department of Education, Culture and Sports (DECS), Palacio del Gobernador, Intramuros, Manila. (Attention: Project Officer, DECS-DEP Special Project on Drug Abuse Prevention Education)
5. The decision of the National Evaluation Team shall be final and unappealable.
