NATIONAL SCIENCE CLUB MONTH CELEBRATION FOR 1987

To: Bureau Directors  
Regional Directors  
Schools Superintendents  
Presidents, State Colleges and Universities  
Heads of Private Schools, Colleges and Universities  
Vocational School Superintendents/Administrators

Inclosed is the schedule of activities for the 1987 National Science Club Month Celebration to be observed in September conformably to Presidential Proclamation No. 20, dated 4 September 1986. As in the past years, SEC-DESI will conduct the activities in coordination with DECS. This year's general theme is "Youth Science Movement for Nation Building".

2. The activities are designed to provide and develop science and technology consciousness among the youth and the general public through the organization and mobilization of science clubs in schools, colleges and universities. Focus weekly activities will be as follows:

- First Week - Science and Technology Breakthroughs in Focus
- Second week - Science Literacy for the Young Minds
- Third Week - Government and Private Sector's Link for Scientific Pursuits
- Fourth Week - Science Clubs in the Service to the Community

3. These activities are intended to support the science and mathematics program of the Department of Education, Culture and Sports and the development of aesthetic and social values among the young. The participation of school pupils and students in these activities is basically voluntary in nature. Cooperation of all concerned is requested to insure a successful conduct of these activities. Care should be exercised, however, that in undertaking such activities there will be no undue disruption of, or interference with, regular classes.



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4. Details of implementation of these activities at each level will be worked out by representatives of the Department of Science and Technology/Science Promotion Institute (DOST/SPI) & by school officials and teachers concerned at their respective levels.

5. SPI will provide travelling, accommodation and meals for official participants in the national level activities to be conducted during the fourth week, as indicated in the attached. Support of interested schools and/or major provinces, teachers and school administrators who wish to attend the fourth week celebration will be checked against local laws, subject to its availability and the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations.

6. It is suggested that a report on the activities undertaken during the month be included in the annual Report.

7. Immediate dissemination of this Memorandum is desired.

### III. REQUIREMENTS FOR PARTICIPATION IN NATIONAL LEVEL ACTIVITIES


1. Participants whether SPI-sponsored or non-SPI sponsored must submit the following upon registration:

2. Non-SPI sponsored participants will be charged P600.00 for board and lodging and administrative cost upon registration.
