STUDY GRANTS FOR REBEL RETURNERS UNDER THE NATIONAL
RECONCILIATION AND DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

Vocational School Superintendents/Administrators

1. This Department, in support of the National Reconciliation and Development Program, a priority government concern established by virtue of Executive Order No. 303 dated December 24, 1986, announces the availability of five hundred (500) study grants for rebel returnees who wish to pursue tertiary level education effective first semester, school year 1987-1988.
2. A qualifying examination will be administered by this Department to determine the educational capabilities and potentials of applicants. Inclosed are the guidelines and other details about these study grants.
3. Awardees have to enrol in schools and courses prescribed by this Department. They will be entitled to the following financial benefits: monthly stipend of ₱100.00; semestral book allowance of ₱250.00; payment of their tuition and school fees, as billed by the school; and graduation allowance of ₱400.00.
4. All school officials and others concerned are hereby enjoined to immediately disseminate the contents of this Memorandum.

GUIDELINES ON THE RECRUITMENT AND SELECTION OF APPLICANTS/
AWARDEES AND CILLS DETAILS OF THE STUDY GRANTS FOR REBEL-
RETURNEE UNDER THE NATIONAL RECONCILIATION
AND DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

A. Qualification Criteria

Applicants to the program must be rebel-returnees:

1. who are recommended by the Bayanihan Center;
2. who are eligible for college (any form of tertiary level education, i.e., degree or non-degree courses);
3. who have signified their intention of pursuing post-secondary education; and
4. who must pass the qualifying examination administered by the DECS.

B. Documents Required

1. Recommendation of the Bayanihan Center
2. Transcript of Records or Ninth Year Form 130 (high school card)
3. Application Form duly accomplished using the attached form

C. Application Procedure

To avail of a study grant, an applicant must:

1. secure a copy of application form from the Office of the Provincial/City Schools Superintendent or Bayanihan Center;
2. accomplish properly and completely the form;
3. attach the required documents; and
4. submit the application form with the required documents to the Division Screening Committee.

D. Screening Committees

The following officials shall compose the Provincial/City Screening Committees:

Schools Superintendent - Chairman

Provincial Reconciliation and Development Council representative - Member

Scholarship Coordinator/
Division Guidance
Supervisor - Member

This Committee will perform the following functions, duties and responsibilities:

1. Process/Evaluate documents of applicants.
2. Submit to the Regional Screening Committee a list of qualified applicants attaching all processed/evaluated documents.
3. Interview applicants.
4. Orient applicants of the schools and courses prescribed by the DECS.
5. Make available to applicants copies of the application forms.
6. Inform applicants of the time and place of the qualifying examination.

The following officials shall compose the Regional Screening Committee:

DECS Regional Director	- Chairman
Regional Reconciliation and Development Council representative	- Member
Scholarship Coordinator	- Member

The Regional Screening Committee will review the documents submitted by the Provincial/City Screening Committees and submit to the Secretary of the DECS a list of qualified applicants attaching all processed/evaluated documents.

F. Policies, Rules and Regulations

Awardees under this program shall be governed by the policies, rules and regulations on study grant programs administered by the MSSIC, DECS.
