1987-1988 REGIONAL SECONDARY SCHOOL PRESS CONFERENCES

1. The Regional Secondary School Press Conference, which are usually held preparatory to the National Secondary School Press Conference (NSSPC), tenth year edition on February 24-27, 1988, should be arranged and conducted in the month or later than the last week of October.
2. The theme of the regional conferences should be "The Role of the School Paper in the National Culture and Progress."
3. These regional conferences may be held for three to five days, depending upon local conditions, and will consist of lecture discussions, guest lectures on the various aspects of newspaper work, one individual writing contest in both English and Filipino, in case writing, feature writing, editorial writing, copyreading and headline writing, and poster writing.
4. Under the direction of the regional director, all schools' superintendents in the provinces or city issues specific rules and regulations relative to the conduct of the regional conference. As much as possible, utilization of excess day or conference should be utilized if not prevented.
5. The writers of the best writing stories in each contest will be decided regional winners. Only three (three) local teacher-advisers may be authorized to attend the NSSPC. No student who can thus be authorized to attend the NSSPC.
6. The administrative officials of the regional press conferences may decide on the amount of registration fee to be charged each delegate and will be liable for any expenses on the conduct of the conference. It is understood that all expense

1. Student or the absence of delegates or officials to the conference will come from local funds, subject to the usual chartering and auditing rules and regulations. The private schools may have their own arrangements regarding the expense of their delegates.

2. To determine any the rules of the conference, the immediate office of the judges may be postponed after those of last year's regional press conferences.

3. Officially after the conference, the regional winners should submit the names of the regional winners, together with the names of their school and division, to this Office, Attention: Chief, Information Division, Technical Service, Fort Monmouth, Patuxent River, Maryland, Sandia Institute in company with the regional judges' the regional participation in the NEBSC.

4. In view of Department policy to keep expenses at the minimum, only one teacher supervisor of the school paper from the school of the regional winner or winners shall be entitled to attend the NEBSC this school year.

5. It is also desired that a memorandum be given maximum publicity, and, especially schools, public and private, so enable as many high school writers and editors as possible to participate in the regional press conferences.

REGULATIONS FOR THE NATIONAL READING CONTESTS

1. Participation in the individual writing contests is limited to students enrolling in the four-year secondary level public or private.
2. A student may participate in not more than two contests.
3. A school newspaper is allowed to enter only one participant in each category.
4. The names of the top 100 winners in each category, both English and in Malpung shall be sent correctly by immediately to their Department of Education county or state, Provincial Capital Region, Incorporated Municipality, The City, Information Officer, Telarit or Vice versa.
5. Failure to comply with these rules shall disqualify the participants in the National Secondary Schools Pre-Confederation (NSPC) contests.
