THIRTEENTH NATIONAL CONGRESS OF COLLEGE STUDENTS  
AND EIGHTH NATIONAL CAMPUS ADVISERS SEMINAR

To: Bureau Directors  
Regional Directors  
Presidents, State Colleges and Universities  
Heads of Private Schools, Colleges and Universities  
Vocational School Superintendents/Administrators

1. In keeping with the government's thrust on ethics and moral responsibility in the education sector, the YMCA of Manila, with the cooperation of the Department of Education, Culture and Sports, will hold the Thirteenth National Congress of College Students and the Eighth National Campus Advisers Seminar at the Senior High Teachers Camp, Baguio City on December 1-4, 1987.
2. The theme of the Congress is "Values and Youth Development" with the following sub-topics:
  - a. For the Congress:
    - (1) The Philosophical Basis of Values, Development of the Youth
    - (2) The Moral and Spiritual Values of the Youth
    - (3) The Social and Political Values of the Youth
  - b. For the Campus Advisers  
Theme: Governance of Student Leaders  
Sub-Topics:
    - (1) Students Rights and Responsibilities and Academic Freedom
    - (2) Academic Policies and Standards Affecting Students
    - (3) Legal Aspects of Student Administration







(4) Organization of Student Personnel  
Administration

(5) Evaluation of Program for Student Development

3. The seminars are organized in either the following countries:

- a. To make the youth understand the values of growth and development of society, its communities.
- b. To reinforce the institution's influence in the acquisition and nurture of youth's qualities, ability, potentials and attitudes.
- c. To imbue youth, through the theoretical framework of a worthwhile society for regional and national development through self-reliant communities.
- d. To provide a working knowledge in the administration and management of student affairs services.
- e. To clarify academic policies and legal issues affecting students in the schools.
- f. To develop the concepts of student development in the administration of student activities.

4. The Congress is open for all college students specifically student leaders involved in leadership training program in their respective schools. They should, however, be recommended by their respective school heads. The advising seminar is open to all faculty members who are involved in student organizations administration.

5. All colleges and universities are urged to participate. Heads of colleges and universities are authorized to recommend not more than two (2) selected students and at least five (5) faculty advisers. Deadline for the submission of application of student and faculty delegates will be on November 15 for provincial delegates and November 20 for Metro Manila delegates.

6. A filing fee and tuition fees per day of Five Hundred Pesos (P500.00), which covers room and a bed, resource, printed materials, pens, ink, and other expenses that may be incurred in connection with attendance in school, shall be borne by the college or university represented in the seminar. All expenses of the participant to the various schools may be charged against local funds, subject to availability and the usual accounting and auditing rules. If no funds are available,







participants may attend the activity or official side. They may also be granted service credit for their attendance in the Congress. As stated in paragraph 3, DECS Memorandum No. 11, s. 1982, a post audit report of the activities and disbursements shall be strictly observed by the sponsoring institution/agency.

7. Certificates of Attendance signed by the College Work Committee Chairman, the President, General Secretary of the YMCA of Manila, and the Executive of the Congress and Advisors/Institutes will be given to each participant.

8. Student and faculty representatives shall submit reports on their participation which shall include a summary of the discussions taken up and the resolutions/recommendations arrived at.
