DECS MEMORANDUM  
No. 252, s. 1987

REQUIRING ALL REGIONS/DIVISIONS TO CONDUCT PLANNING  
WORKSHOPS FOR DISTRICT NFE COORDINATORS

To: Bureau Directors  
Regional Directors  
School Superintendents

1. A national NFE planning conference was held last July in Taguig City which was participated in by regional directors or assistant regional directors, and regional and division NFE supervisors. To complete the planning process and come up with the DECS NFE Program for 1988 and for 1988-1992, it is necessary to bring together all the district NFE coordinators to a planning workshop of each division.

2. The general objective of this workshop is to plan together how they will conduct their respective planning at the district and school/community levels. Thus, within two weeks after the workshop, they are expected to undertake the planning at the district/community levels with the participation of the community leaders and clientele sector representatives. Another objective of this workshop is to assess the training needs of the district NFE coordinators.

3. Afterwards, they shall have the draft plans prepared which shall include the following:

- a. General situation in the district/community with respect to the priority clientele of DECS NFE (out-of-school youth, unemployed adults, illiterates);
- b. Current status with respect to on-going NFE projects/activities (DECS and non-DECS); contacts; funding; linkages; etc.;
- c. Quantitative NFE training targets for 1988 and 1988-1992 (literacy; livelihood skills training; values development);
- d. Budget and other resource requirements for 1988 and 1988-1992 (realistic, feasible and can be expected to be generated); their expected sources (governmental and non-governmental); and
- e. Monitoring and evaluating mechanism.

4. As much as possible, the NFE program should reach out to the priority clientele in the communities (community-based) while continuing to undertake viable and relevant school-based NFE projects/activities.







5. In order to carry out the aforesaid objectives more efficiently and to achieve better expectancies, moderate funding assistance for this planning workshop will be provided by the Bureau of Nonformal Education based on the categorization listed in the inclosure to this Memorandum. The amount intended for each division will be sent in the form of checks to the regional directors concerned who will be responsible for the allocation and liquidation of said financial assistance, subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations.

6. It is desired that a work plan for each school division, indicating among others the venue, date and activities to be undertaken in this particular workshop, be furnished the Bureau of Nonformal Education soonest. It is suggested that the planning workshop be held not later than January 31, 1960.

7. Immediate dissemination of this Memorandum to all concerned is enjoined.
