1980 REGIONAL EDUCATIONAL DISCUSSION PRESS CONFERENCE

1. Regional Directors

2. The National Secondary Schools Press Conference will be held for the school year 1980-1981 at the National Secondary School in Quezon City on February 22-23, 1981, under the Division of Secondary School.

3. The theme of the year's conference is "The Role of the School Press in Education for National Unity and Democracy".

4. All the secondary winners in each of the ten regional tournaments in the annual schools press conferences, the superintendents of the regions, the heads of the Bureau/Department, the supervisor/coordinate in whose division, the officers of the National Secondary Schools Teachers Association (NSTEA), and the officers of the National Secondary School Press Adviser (NSSPPA), as well as the officers in the Regional Secondary School Paper Adviser's Association (RSPAA) are authorized to attend the conference.

5. Convened in DED Memorandum No. 171, s. 1987, the regional offices shall submit the names of the regional winners together with the names of their adviser and supervisor/divisional supervisor after the holding of the regional press conference. The Office, Attention: Chief, Press and Division, "Press Services," Bus. Bldg., Patapat, Diliman, Quezon City, Manila, Philippines, shall be furnished the School Superintendents of the Bureau of Education. These winners shall participate fully in the meeting in which they will be regional winners. Regional superintendents/teachers supervisors shall be invited to attend the conference.

6. Each individual-delegate in the meeting shall be given a name tag to be attached on the NSSPPA shirt which will be given during the conference. The shirt shall be worn by the







Delegate at all times and on all places during the conference. Except when invited or with his/her wife, no student-delegate or teacher-advisor shall be allowed to stay in or do the following activities during one day sessions:

6. Because of the cool climate of the conference site, it is recommended that one should take along a sweater, jacket, flannel pajama or nightgown, or other warm clothing.

7. Inclosed is the tentative list of activities and other information relating to the Conference.

8. For purposes of the group awards, school papers are bracketed into two A and B. The bracketing is based on the school provisions, the school paper's location, the printing facilities available to it, and its performance in the last two national press conferences.

9. The principal of each school entering the group contests should furnish the concerned office, division (for those schools whose issue of the paper publishing during the school year 1979/1980 to 1980/1981) or center the name of the 1980-1981 Elementary High schools that publish separate English and Tagalog papers may enter only one of them in the English press category and one of the Filipino paper. In the warrant should be indicated the total enrollment of the schools. The funds to be allocated will

10. For purposes of simplicity and economy, there will be no selecting of Miss NSBPC this school year. Instead a cultural show by the local clubs will be held.

11. Requests for accommodation should be made directly to the Schools Superintendents or Education and Labor Office (January 6, 1981). Such requests should include information on the names of the delegates, the date of the school conference authorized to attend the conference, the approximate time and date of arrival of the delegation and the means of transportation to be taken in case of emergency. If the bus from Marikina to Ortigas City to the conference site in Bel-Air Valley, Makati may be utilized, their fares. Each delegation should arrange for its transportation to the conference site and return.

12. Bus fare layout of P100.00 per head including fare of P75 and P50 transportation fee for one educational tour to a development center in another city will be charged on delegations. A membership fee of P10 from the National Secondary School Principals Association (NSSPA) will be collected by the treasurer during the conference. Bus fare layout of the







other than, or to students/delegates, teacher-trainers, and other school officials, carried and/or incurred by day, by night, or against the local/divisional funds, subject to the usual accounting and spending rules and regulations. The schools/colleges may make their own arrangements regarding the expenses of their delegates.

(3) No student, teacher or school official who is not a member of the school should be included in the delegation. Students/ delegates should also write on application of their parents/guardians before making the trip up the covariance.

(4) Immediate dissemination of this memorandum to all public and private secondary schools is issued.


