SUPPORT FOR THE THIRD NATIONAL ASSEMBLY OF THE NATIONAL
FEDERATION OF STUDENT COUNCILS

To: Regional Directors
Schools Superintendents
Presidents, State Colleges and Universities
Heads of Private Schools, Colleges and Universities
Schools Principals

1. The National Federation of Student Councils, with the cooperation of the Department of Education, Culture and Sports and the Commission on Higher Education, will conduct its National Assembly dubbed as the "Student Leaders' National Assembly" on February 7-9 at the Countryside Pavilion Pension and Training Center, Ungka II, Pavia, Iloilo City.
2. The National Assembly will provide a venue for the Federation to amend its constitution, conduct an election of officers, and work on organizational matters which shall further strengthen the Federation's commitment to youth service and empowerment.
3. Invited to participate in this National Assembly on official time are top college and high school student council officers from the NFSC roster of member schools. One (1) delegate from each participating student council is invited to attend and will be charged a registration fee of five hundred pesos (P500.00). This fee shall cover round-trip economy fare (to and from Iloilo City), board and lodging for three (3) days and two (2) nights, I.D., convention portfolio with reading materials and certificate of participation.
4. Additional participants from each member school council will be charged a registration fee of nine hundred pesos (P900.00) each (exclusive of transportation).
5. Invited also to participate are student council officers of nonmember schools. They will be charged a registration fee of one thousand pesos (P1,000.00) each (exclusive of transportation) as observers.
6. Inclosed is the tentative schedule of activities and orientation paper of the Federation, for the information and guidance of the field.

7. In view of the formation of student leaders for national development which will be derived from this project, the full support of all concerned is hereby enjoined.

8. Immediate and extensive dissemination of this Memorandum is hereby enjoined.

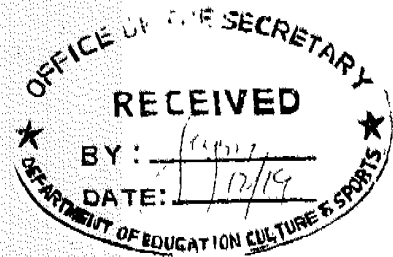



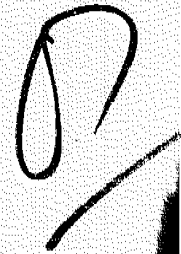
