Statement of H. E. President Fidel V. Ramos
Re: Prayer Rally at Luneta, Homily of Cardinal Sin and
Statement of Former President Aquino
Malacañang, Manila
September 21, 1997

First of all, let me thank the Filipino people for coming out and exercising their sovereign right to assemble peacefully and to be heard. Also, my commendations go to our law enforcement people, principally the PNP which was assisted by the AFP, and our local government officials who exerted their utmost efforts to protect the people and prevent malefactors from doing any harm.

On behalf of our people and our Government, let me also congratulate and thank former President Corazon C. Aquino and His Eminence Jaime Cardinal Sin for their messages for reconciliation, humility, forgiveness, and unity. The declaration of Cory Aquino that our economic health has been restored is most appreciated because it does give the correct signal to all that the nation is not really in crisis, and that the Philippine house is not "burning" as some opinion-makers have been insisting of late.

All of us are happy that the prayer rallies at the Luneta and everywhere else were carried out. This is a manifestation that democracy in our country is very much alive, and protected by both government and people.

One point, however, should be clarified. It is not true that your President has been changing his mind constantly on the issues related to charter change. On the contrary, in my several State of the Nation Addresses (SONAs) and Ulat-sa-Bayan reports since 1992, the latest being last July 28, 1997, I have been consistent in my vision for the nation (Philippines 2000), our plan of action to achieve social, economic and human development during my term of office (Philippine Development Plan for 1992 - 1998) and our long-range strategy for sustainable development (Pole-Vaulting into the 21st century).

Above all, let us thank the Almighty for keeping us peaceful, united and free. Surely, we shall be truly deserving of His blessings and bounty if we help ourselves more, perform our duties better, and prepare our young Filipinos more effectively for the challenges of competition and modernization.

So, let us go back to work and move on!!

PREPARING OUR YOUTH

The entrepreneurs, foundations and religious orders running our many private schools must re-set their priorities and re-shape their educational programs for the requirements of the new millennium. This is a moral reponsibility that we owe to our children and our community.

This is a vital part of our focusing on the 21st century.

Let us, therefore, avoid exploiting our power over our children to conscript them for our partisan political causes. Let us stop infusing into them the worst aspects of Philippine politics which, unfortunately, is divisive in nature. Instead, let us prepare our youth to adequately cope with the challenges of the future.

This I would want to be my legacy to our country.
