SEMINAR ON CREATING AND CHANNELLING EDUCATIONAL
CHANGE IN PHILIPPINE LIBRARIANSHIP

The Philippine Association of Teachers of Library Science (PATLS) in cooperation with Fund for Assistance to Private Education (FAPE) will be holding a "Seminar on Creating and Channelling Educational Change in Philippine Librarianship" on May 4-6, 1998 at the Audio Visual Room, Education Building, University of the East, C.
