DECS MEMORANDUM No. 267, s. 1998

MEASLES "CATCH-UP" MONTH/CAMPAIGN

To: Undersecretaries

Assistant Secretaries

All Others Concerned

- 1. In response to the call for support from the Department of Health for the Philippine Measles Elimination Campaign, a measles "Catch-Up" Month Campaign shall be implemented to attain the goal of total measles elimination throughout the country.
- 2. The campaign starts on September 16 up to October 14, 1998, wherein all children ages 9 months to 15 years old are to be immunized. Children ages 6 years and above shall be immunized in the schools.
- 3. In order to successfully implement the said activity, the following are the roles/responsibilities of concerned personnel:
 - A. All school health and nutrition personnel (MD, DMD, PHN and Nutritionists)

1. On Advocacy

- a. Issuance of regional and division memoranda on the Measles Elimination Campaign (MEC);
- b. Orientation of DECS officials and school administrators on the MEC and on DECS' Role:
- c. Orientation of teachers and parents;
- Regional Health and Nutrition Unit staff to orient division medical officers and division MDs to orient health personnel at their levels; and
- e. Assist in the implementation of the postermaking contest on the campaign.

2. On Monitoring and Evaluation

- a. Monitoring of actual administration of vaccines;
- Preparation of city/provincial/regional consolidated report of vaccinated and unvaccinated children including constraints and problems encountered;
- Assistance to the evaluation of the program; and
- d. Preparation of the list of students whose parents refuse to sign consent slips.

B. School Physicians and Nurses

1. On Facilitation

- a. Estimation of the number of children and logistics in collaboration with provincial/city/rural health units (RHUs) personnel;
- Distribution/collection of information sheets and consent slips;
- c. Coordination of various activities from preparatory to actual immunization and reporting during vaccination sessions;
- d. Fill-up Form 2 (Part II) and Form 3, Consolidated information on MEC schoolbased immunization; and
- e. Preparation of logistics estimates.

2. On Actual Vaccination

- a. Assistance to RHU personnel in the administration of measles vaccines to school children;
- b. Assistance to the proper disposal of used needles; and
- c. Coordination with teachers and school administrators on the orderly/systematic administration of the vaccines.

C. Teachers

- 1. Preparation of the masterlist of all school children:
- Conduct of advocacy on MEC during PTA meetings in order to motivate parents to allow their children to be vaccinated;
- Distribution and collection of consent slips for submission to health personnel:
- Integration of core messages on vaccination in classroom teaching; and
- Assistance to health personnel in the actual vaccination and in the preparation of reports.

D. School Administrators

- Accountability on the conduct of MECS activities in the school;
- Dissemination of information regarding MECS and discussion of activities to teachers;
- Coordination with school health personnel and rural health personnel on the conduct of activities like referral, reporting, evaluating, poster-making, etc.

4. Assurance that the core messages on measles prevention and control shall be integrated in appropriate subject areas;

- 5. Coordination with teachers on the implementation of the Poster-Making Contest; and
- 6. Preparation of final report.
- 4. The School Health and Nutrition Center in the Central Office and the Regional Health and Nutrition units shall be responsible for the over-all coordination of the activities at their respective levels. It is requested that the report on these activities be included in the 3rd Quarter Report on School Health for 1998.
- 5. For immediate dissemination and compliance.
