ANNOUNCEME<u>N</u>T

1.0 Conference Concept:

The 1998 Centennial Conference on Literacy and Continuing Education is a response to issues and concerns raised in the Hamburg Conference on Adult Literacy and the LCC Literacy Conference, in 1997. Both fora emphasized the need to come up with new indicators of a functionally literate individual who can cope with the demands of the 21st century. This Conference will therefore, review the new definition of functional literacy as prepared by a group of experts convened by the Literacy Coordinating Council.

The Three (3) mains concerns of the Conference are: (1) Information, education and communication/social mobilization for all actors in eradication of illiteracy (EOI) and continuing education (CED,) especially the newly-elected Local Chief Executives LCEs); (2) program, policy and research responses to the Hamburg declaration on adult literacy and Jacques Delors' four pillars of learning; and (3) to maximize the utilization of Regional (Asia-Pacific) insights on policies and programs for EOI and CED.

2.0 Conference Theme and Objectives:

The following are intended to provide all the participants of the conference a clear guide towards its intended outcome.

- 2.1 Theme: "Beyond Borders Through Expanded Partnerships in Building Learning Communities"
- 2.2 Objectives:
 - 2.2.1 review the various contexts of learning and the state of the art and practice in literacy and lifelong learning.

- **2.2.2** revisit Delors' four pillars of learning with focus on peace and environment education
- **2.2.3** recommend strategies designed to strengthen and expand established networks for expansion of linkages

3.0 Participants

The Conference is expected to draw together national and Regional (Asia-Pacific) participants and guests involved in policy-making, research, management and provision of services on adult and functional literacy, particularly for persons with disabilities, women and young girls and those from the cultural communities.

Local and foreign agencies concerned with the Eradication of Illiteracy (EOI) and Continuing Education (CED) have also been invited to lend to the achievement of the conference objectives. The LCC through its member, DILG, will exert efforts to have as many newly-elected Local Chief Executives as possible as a start of a series of activities that will help the LCEs appreciate their role in EOI as provided in the Social Reform Agenda and MC 71. (Strengthening the Resolve to Eradicate Illiteracy By the Year 2000)

Approximately 250 participants and guests are expected to attend this year's conference.

4.0 Convenors

Main convenor of the 1998 Centennial Conference on Literacy and Continuing Education is the Literacy Coordinating Council (LCC). The LCC has eight (8) members, namely: Department of Education, Culture and Sports (DECS), Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG), National Economic Development Authority (NEDA), Philippine Normal University (PNU), Philippine Information Agency (PIA), Non-government Agency (NGO), the House of Representatives and the Senate, committe on Education.

Cooperating agencies are the Southeast Asian Ministers of Education Organization Regional Center for Educational Innovation and Technology (SEAMEO-INNOTECH), Foundation for Continuing Education (FORCE), UNESCO National Commission of the Philippines (UNACOM) and the National Bookstore (NBS)

5.0 Strategies/Activities

To achieve its objectives, this year's Literacy Conference proposes the following strategies/activities:

- **5.1** <u>Direction setting</u> relative to the theme and its objectives by local and foreign speakers
- **5.2** Experience Sharing through a panel of local and foreign speakers who have been invited to explore the theme and objectives of the conference in the context of their own country.
- **5.3** <u>Workshops</u> that will validate the new definition of functional literacy and its attendant set of indicators
- 5.4 <u>Recognition</u> of outstanding efforts towards EOI and CED through the 1998 National Literacy Awards to outstanding literacy worker, outstanding literacy program and outstanding local government unit.

Past members of the LCC and the Technical Working Group will aslo be honored for the help and guidance they have extended to the LCC.

- **Conference Costs** is a shared responsibility. Participants, member agencies and NGOs will underwrite the cost of travel; while the LCC provides for the costs for board and lodging and other conference incidentals.
