19th ANNUAL NATIONAL CMLI GRADE SCHOOL CONFERENCE

To : Bureau Directors

Public and Private Elementary School Principals

1. The Children's Museum and Library Inc. (CMLI) will hold the 19th Annual National Grade School Conference on September 2-6, 1998 at the Teachers' Camp, Baguio City. The theme of the Conference will be "Kabataanahan: Likas sa Ating Kabataan Noon at Ngayon".
2. The main activities of the Conference include workshops/commission discussions and group discussions featuring modules on leadership training, values formation, interpersonal relations and communications. Likewise, competitions on story writing, story telling, poem writing and delivery, poster making, cultural performances to showcase collective endeavors, sportsfest and socials will be conducted. These activities aim to educate the young, thereby, increasing their awareness of certain socio-economic developments in the community and places around them.
3. The Conference is open to all public and private schools. Pupil-participants should come from the intermediate grades (grades V, VI or VII) and should be school paper editors, members of the honor roll and officers of school/pupil government organizations. They should possess good leadership qualities, good moral character and good physical health. Likewise, teacher-participants who will serve as coaches/chaperons must be of good moral character and of good physical health.

4. The conference fee for this five-day activity is **Three Thousand Five Hundred Pesos** (P3,500.00) for each pupil and per teacher delegate. This will be chargeable against local funds subject to its availability and the usual accounting and auditing requirements. The fee includes board and lodging, conference materials, souvenir program and other training expenses. Transportation to and from the conference site is not included. Participants from private institutions should make arrangements with their respective institution heads.
5. Pupil delegates will undergo make-up classes to cover lessons missed for the whole duration of the activity. Likewise, teachers may be allowed to participate provided appropriate arrangements be made for make-up classes.
6. Schools interested to join the conference must make their reservations either by phone, facsimile or at the CMLI Secretariat located at Unit 7, Fersal Condominium II, 130 Kalayaan Avenue, Diliman, Quezon City with telephone nos. (FAXPhone) 924-2304 and 924-2297 on or before August 18, 1998.

GUIDELINES

ELIGIBILITY

The Conference is open to pupils of public and private elementary schools nationwide. Schools are advised to send their pupils who are school paper editors, members of the honor roll and officers of their school/pupil government organizations in the intermediate grades (Grades V, VI or VII). Aside from leadership and academic qualifications, pupil delegates must be of good moral character and of good physical health. Teacher delegates who will serve as coaches/chaperons must be of good moral character and of good physical health, too.

CONFERENCE FEE

The conference fee of this five-day activity is Three Thousand Five Hundred Pesos (P3,500.00) for each pupil and per teacher delegate. This fee is inclusive of board and lodging, conference materials, souvenir program and other training expenses. Transportation to and from the conference site is NOT included.

ATTIRE

Delegates are required to wear centennial attire during the opening and closing ceremonies. Since sports activities will be held, appropriate attire is desired. Please bring enough warm clothing considering the cool weather of Baguio.

LIST OF ACTIVITIES

OPENING CEREMONIES: The Graders' Conference will not be complete without the formal opening ceremonies which is usually graced by prominent figures as keynote speakers. In connection with this year's centennial celebration, the delegates and their teacher-advisers are required to wear their centennial Filipiniana attire.

CONTESTS: There shall be an ART SOCIALS Contest by block and the best performing group will be given due recognition. A SPORTSFEST in the form of "Laro ng Lahi" will also be held. Details will be discussed by the blocks during the conference proper.

DULAWISAY (Dula, awit, Sayaw '98): A talent variety show among participating schools shall be held. Interested school delegations must prepare before hand since no time will be given for rehearsals. CMLI reserves the right to screen performers. Group performances are given a maximum of eight (8) minutes. No more individual performances.

COMPETITIONS FOR EXCELLENCE: The convention shall have the following contests: essay writing contest, timpalak dagliang sanaysay, extemporaneous public speaking, timpalak dagliang talumpatiian, (CMLI will provide the piece) poem writing and delivery contest, timpalak dagliang pagcuculat at pagtula, sculpture making contest and on-the-spot poster making contest. Participants are allowed to join only one contest. Contestants for the poster making should bring their own art materials. Only one delegate per commission is allowed to participate in each contest.

SYMPOSIA: Part of this week-long activity is a symposium entitled "Mga Bayani ng Makabagong Panahon" which will showcase the modern heroes of today. Another symposium will focus on child psychology. Prominent figures will be invited to tackle these subjects and the delegates will be given a chance to interact with the guests through an open forum.

SPORTSFEST: Stressing friendly competitions, teamwork, physical fitness, the delegates get to show off their skills and sportsmanship during this inter-block activity.

FILM SHOWING: During the conference, we will be featuring a film entitled "Minsan Lang Sila Mga Bata". This film focuses on the present situation of child labor and poverty in the Philippines.

WORKSHOPS: Several workshops shall be staged featuring renowned speakers on topics ranging from Arts to Community Development.

CMLI EXHIBIT OF HEROES: During the conference, the delegates will have the chance to see and appreciate the works of our heroes through the CMLI Exhibit of Heroes. The CMLI Exhibit of Heroes showcases the various works of our heroes to instill in the minds of the delegates the richness of Filipino Culture.

DISCO SOCIALS: After the week-long activities of the conference will be a time for the delegates to unwind. The delegates will be treated to a night of fun and enjoyment. The Disco Socials will follow right after the Closing Ceremonies.
