1998 REGIONAL AND NATIONAL SCHOOLS PRESS CONFERENCES

To: Bureau Directors
Regional Directors
Schools Superintendents

Vocational High School Principals

- 1. As part of the continuing program to promote campus journalism, the 1998 National Schools Press Conference (NSPC) will be held on December 6-11, 1998 at Ilagan, Isabela, Region II. This will be preceded by the Regional Schools Press Conferences which will be conducted not later than the last week of October 1998.
- 2. The theme of this year's conference is: "Responsible Journalism: Vanguard of Freedom". Its objectives are:
 - a. to provide a forum for free and responsible journalism;
 - to provide learning experiences where values such as the pursuit of truth, fairness and objectivity may be exemplified;
 - to upgrade the journalistic competencies of student-writers as well as
 of teacher-advisers through quality journalism program at the school
 level; and
 - d. to enhance school paper management to make it more relevant and dynamic.
- 3. A total of 4,337 regional winners and their school paper advisers, regional and national association officers, division supervisors concerned, central office officials and others as specified in the Inclosure (para. 11 & 12, pp. 7 & 8) are expected to participate in the NSPC.

- The regional conferences and the NSPC shall be partly subsidized from the 4. Campus Journalism Fund (R.A. 7079) but minimal registration fees from participants to augment available resources shall be charged against local funds subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations. Participants from the private schools shall make necessary arrangements with their respective institutions in connection with their attendance in the Conference.
- Special pupils/students may be allowed to participate in the individual writing contests as long as they comply with the special arrangements described under the "National Schools Press Conference" (See Inclosure).

A. Regional Press Conference

- 1. The regional conference shall not be more than three (3) days. It shall consist of lecture-discussions on important and relevant issues/topics, and individual writing contests in both English and Filipino.
- 2. Each teacher-participant shall pay FIVE HUNDRED SIXTY PESOS (P 560.00) while each student-participant shall pay FIVE HUNDRED THIRTY PESOS (P 530.00) upon registration.
- 3. The amount of FTVE HUNDRED PESOS (P 500.00) represents the registration fee while the SIXTY PESOS (P 60.00) from the teacher-delegate goes to the membership fee in the regional and national school paper advisers association (elementary and secondary). THIRTY PESOS (P 30.00) of said amount shall be retained with the regional association while THIRTY PESOS (P 30.00) shall be remitted by the RSSPAA president to the NSSPAA/PAESPA treasurer during the NSPC.
- 4. On the other hand, the amount of THIRTY PESOS (P 30.00) to be paid by each student-delegate represents the membership fee in the Regional and National Editors Guild. FIFTEEN PESOS (P 15.00) of this amount shall be retained with the Regional Editors Guild while FIFTEEN PESOS (P 15.00) shall be remitted to the treasurer of the National Editors Guild during the NSPC.
- 5. Pupils/students may participate in the following individual writing contests at the elementary and secondary levels:

Elementary: News Writing

Editorial Writing Feature Writing

Copyreading and Headline Writing

Sports Writing

- 5.1 A pupil/student shall be allowed to participate in only two (2) categories in the same medium.
- 5.2 A school shall have only one (1) contestant per category.
- 5.3 There shall be five (5) winners for each category at the elementary level and seven (7) winners for each category at the secondary level for each Region.
- 6. The Regional Director shall submit to the Office of the Secretary (Attn.: The Director, Bureau of Secondary Education, U.L. Complex, Pasig City).
 - 6.1 a certified list of regional winners for the individual contests together with the names of their schools and divisions;
 - 6.2 the list of teacher advisers to attend the NSPC;
 - 6.3 the name of the Outstanding Secondary School Paper Adviser; and
 - 6.4 the name of the Outstanding Secondary School Campus
 Journalist

one (1) week after the Regional Schools Press Conference (RSPC).

A copy shall be furnished the Director, DECS RO II, Carig, Tuguegarao, Cagayan. Likewise, the names of special pupils/students who are regional winners should be specified in the list together with a description of their handicaps. This information will enable the DECS Organizing Committee to institute necessary arrangements for their participation in the national contests.

- 7. Regional Directors, particularly the Director of DECS RO II, are authorized to draw a cash advance from any appropriate local fund to meet expenses in preparation for the RSPCs, such cash advance to be reimbursed from collections of registration fees and the subsidy from the Campus Journalism Fund (R.A. 7079). The subsidy shall be released upon submission (Attn.: Director Alberto P. Mendoza, BSE) of the design of and the budget for the Regional Press Conference.
- 8. Failure to observe the guidelines or comply with the rules shall automatically disqualify participants from the NSPC contests.

B. National Schools Press Conference (NSPC)

- 1. The activities in connection with the NSPC are:
 - speeches/lectures covering various aspects of school paper work by distinguished, practising journalists and professors of journalism;
 - individual writing contests identical to those at the regional level;
 - educational tour;

- awarding ceremony for outstanding regional secondary school paperadviser and school paper-editor (to be handled by the National Association in coordination with the Host Region); and
- awarding ceremony for the winners in the different individual and group contest categories for both elementary and secondary levels as well as the overall champion region in the individual contests and the overall champion region for the group contests.
- 2. No student alternate shall be allowed in case the real regional winner cannot participate in the NSPC.
- 3. Another teacher-adviser may be allowed to take the place of an adviser who will not be able to participate in the NSPC for as long as the required number of regional delegates is maintained. However, no additional teacher-delegate shall be allowed in cases where the teacher-adviser is the adviser of two (2) winners.
- 4. The following arrangements shall be observed for special pupils/students who will participate in the Individual Writing Contests:
 - 4.1 The head of the regional delegation shall be responsible for the special travel arrangements to the contest site and during all the NSPC activities participated in by the pupil/student;
 - 4.2 Contestants who are blind may be accompanied by a teacher-adviser to the contest room but the latter should leave the room after the student is safely seated. The guide may fetch him/her when the contest is over:
 - 4.3 Blind contestants are required to bring their own braille machine.

 The proctor shall read the written instructions for said contestants.

- 5. In the event that there are special (blind) pupil/student participants in the NSPC, a staff from the Special Education Division (SPED) of the Bureau of Elementary Education shall serve as facilitator, to decode the text from the braille machine.
- 6. The first official activity of the NSPC shall be a parade to be participated in by all delegations on December 6 at 4:00 p.m. The host shall serve the first meal (lunch) on the same day, and the last meal (lunch) on December 12, 1998.
- 7. The group contests are open to all elementary and secondary school newspapers published in SY 1998-1999, whether or not they are represented by delegates at the NSPC. The contest shall involve the following categories of student publications: Bracket A and B (elementary); Bracket A and B (secondary). The specifications for each bracket follow:

Elementary: (Size - 9" x 12")

Bracket A publication

- a) standard printed newsletter; and
- b) with at least 8 pages

Bracket B publication

- a) mimeographed student publications, newsletter and the like, provided they follow the standard style of print journalism; and
- b) with at least 8 pages

Secondary: (Size - 12" x 18")

Bracket A publication

- a) standard printed broadsheet or tabloid;
- b) with 14-20 pages; and
- c) must have been in circulation for at least five years

Bracket B publication

- a) standard printed broadsheet or tabloid; and
- b) with 8-12 pages

8. The categories for the group contests are as follows:

Best Layout/Page Design
Best News Page
Best Editorial Page
Best Features/Literary Page
Best Sports Page
Best Developmental Journalism Reporting/Page
Best Science Reporting/Page

- 9. The principal/administrator of each school participating in the group contests shall send by registered mail on or before October 16, 1998, eighteen (18) copies of one (1) issue of a bilingual issue of a school paper published in SY 1998-1999 or nine (9) copies each of the Filipino and the English paper if the school has both, properly labelled as Bracket A or B (Elementary): or Bracket A or B (Secondary). There will be no extension of the deadline. The bundle shall be addressed to: The Director, Bureau of Secondary Education, 3rd Floor, Bonifacio Bldg., U.L. Complex, Meralco Ave., Pasig City, (Attention: Mrs. Oliva P. Dantes).
- 10. The criteria for the choice of the best newspaper entries per category are attached separately from the Inclosure to this DECS Memorandum.
- 11. The total number of participants in every regional delegation is 256 broken down as follows:
 - 98 high school student-winners [7 categories x 7 winners x 2 (English and Filipino)]
 - 70 high school student-advisers [7 categories x 5 advisers x 2 (English and Filipino)]
 - 1 outstanding secondary school campus journalist
 - 1 outstanding secondary school paper adviser
 - 50 elementary school pupil-winners [5 categories x 5 winners x 2 (English and Filipino)]
 - 30 elementary school paper advisers [5 categories x 3 advisers x 2 (English and Filipino)]
 - 1 Chief or Asst. Chief, Elementary Education Division
 - 1 Chief or Asst. Chief, Secondary Education Division
 - 1 Regional Supervisor in-charge of Journalism (either English or Filipino, either elementary or secondary)
 - 1 President of the Regional Editors Guild
 - 1 President of the Regional Association of Elementary School Paper
 - 1 President of the Regional Association of Secondary School Paper Advisers

- 12. Other participants to the NSPC (241) are as follows:
 - 30 Central Office working committees
 - Officers of the Philippine Association of Elementary School Paper Advisers (PAESPA)
 - Officers of the National Secondary School Paper Advisers Association (NSSPAA)
 - 30 Local working committees
 - 139 Division supervisors in-charge of Journalism (English or Filipino)
 - 24 Resource speakers
- 13. The Registration Committee shall not accept any person who is not a legitimate member of the delegation as specified in the Inclosure. However, the Committee shall receive from each Regional School Paper Advisers Association (RSPAA) president (elementary and secondary) the total collection of the school paper advisers' membership in the region. The collection should be turned over to the respective treasurers of the two (2) national associations (elementary and secondary).
- 14. Each delegate to the NSPC shall pay a registration fee of <u>ONE THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED PESOS (P 1,500.00).</u>
- 15. A certificate of good physical and mental health issued by a government doctor and certified by the Regional Director shall be required from all delegates (students, teacher-advisers and officials) upon registration.
- 16. The Conference is a live-in activity. No student-delegate, teacher-adviser and supervisor, shall be allowed to stay outside the site.
- 17. Requests of regional delegations for accommodation at the NSPC site shall be sent to: The Director, DECS RO II, Carig, Tuguegarao, Cagayan, copy furnished the Schools Division Superintendent, Ilagan, Isabela and the Bureau of Secondary Education, Bonifacio Bldg., U.L. Complex, Meralco Ave., Pasig City not later than November 6, 1998. The list of members of the regional delegation certified by the regional director, with the males separated from the females should accompany the request.
- 18. Information about the kind of transportation the delegation will take to the NSPC site, as well as the date and time of arrival, shall be provided the host region at least two (2) weeks before the date of its arrival. Arrangements for transportation to the conference site shall be made by the host region but expenses shall be borne by the delegation.
