

# ATTENDANCE TO THE NATIONAL ROVER MOOT OF THE BOY SCOUTS OF THE PHILIPPINES

- 1. The Boy Scouts of the Philippines, in cooperation with the Department of Education, Culture and Sports, is pleased to announce the holding of the National Rover Moot on October 20 24, 1998 at the Scout City, University of Eastern Philippines, Catarman, Northern Samar.
- 2. The event, which has for its centennial celebration theme "LOOK WIDER", aims to provide a variety of opportunities for personal growth and development and to participate in the demonstration of leadership skills both in Scouting and in the community.
- Participants to this activity are Rovers, Roverettes, and Rover Peers who are
  mostly teachers from the elementary, secondary and tertiary levels, and high school
  and college students in public and private schools.
- An activity fee of Two Hundred Pesos only (P 200.00) shall be charged each participant to cover costs of souvenir items, program materials and other operational budgetary needs. Participants/Contingents are expected to manage their own funding requirements, camping gears, transportation requirements, and sufficient food supply to last for the duration of the event and travel period to and from the campsite. Expenses to be incurred may be sourced from local funds and or solicitations from private organizations.
- 5. Considering the significant benefits that will be obtained in joining this event, all teacher-scouters and students in public and private schools, who shall be on official time, are encouraged to participate actively. The Center for Students and Co-Curricular Affairs (CSCA) is in charge of coordinating and monitoring the participation of the DECS personnel.

Local Councils/Contingents are expected to manage their own: a) Moot funding requirements; b) camping gears (shelter, kitchen, utensils, camp tools/equipment, etc); c) transportation requirements to and from the Moot site; and, d) sufficient food supply to last for the duration of the event and the travel period to and from the campsite.
- A thorough and extensive promotion and publicity of this event must be initiated by all concerned in order to meet the required quota of participation. Strategic information dissemination of this memorandum will help in our aim of making Scouting visible.
