1998 SEARCH FOR THE OUTSTANDING BOY SCOUTS OF THE PHILIPPINES (TOBS)

- 1. The Boy Scouts of the Philippines (BSP), in cooperation with the Department of Education, Culture and Sports (DECS) and with support from The Coca-Cola Export Corporation (TCCEC), is pleased to announce the 1998 Search for The Outstanding Boy Scouts of the Philippines (TOBS).
- The aim of the search is to give due recognition to Scouts who best epitomise sterling qualities of school and community leadership, academic excellence and good moral character. These Scouts shall serve as role models to their fellow youth in terms of skills and values learned and imbibed in the Scouting Movement.
- 3. This year's search will be conducted in the local, regional and national levels. It is open to Boy Scouts who are Filipino citizens, currently registered and at least third year high school students.
- 4. The Selection Committee in the Regional Council Level shall be composed of the following:

 At the regional awarding ceremony, a cash prize of P 2,000.00 each and a certificate will be awarded to the Regional winners while participating Local Councils and Schools will be given certificates.

At the national awarding ceremony, the winners of The Outstanding Boy Scouts of the Philippines for 1998 will receive trophies, medals, cash prize amounting to PhP 5,000.00 each and a two-year scholarship in a state college/university consisting of the cost of tuition, books and school uniforms (if any) and transportation allowance of PhP 3,000.00 a year.

TOBS runners up shall receive a cash prize of P 2,000.00 each, including plaques and medallions.

Local Councils and Schools represented by the Regional winners will be given Plaques of Recognition.

- 6. In view of the significance of this Search in the holistic development of the youth, all concerned are enjoined to participate and support this undertaking. At the DECS Central Office, the Center for Students and Co-Curricular Affairs (CSCA) is assigned to coordinate and monitor field participation to ensure the success of the search. SUBJECT: 1998 SEARCH FOR THE OUTSTANDING BOY SCOUTS OF THE PHILIPPINES

- To give due recognition to our Scouts who best epitomise sterling qualities of school and community
 leadership, academic excellence and good moral character, the Boy Scouts of the Philippines is
 pleased to announce the 1998 Search for The Outstanding Boy Scouts of the Philippines (TOBS).
- The search is open to Boy Scouts who are Filipino citizens, currently registered and at least third year, high school students.
- 3. This year's search will be conducted on local, regional and national levels.
- 4. The selection Committee on the Regional/Local Council levels will be composed of the following:

 The number of winners in the Local Council to compete in the Regional Level will be based on the March 1998 Scout Membership categorized as follows:

Council with a membership of 100,000 and above - 5 nominees 50,000 to 99,999 - 2 nominees Below 50,000 - 1 nominee

6. The number of Regional winners, to be selected based on the March 1998 Scout Membership, with a minimum of two and a maximum of five are as follows:

llocos Region - 2
Central Luzon Region - 2
Northeastern Luzon Region - 2
National Capital Region - 3
Southern Tagalog Region - 5
Bicol Region 2
Western Visayas Region - 2
Eastern Visayas Region - 3
Western Mindanao Region - 2
Eastern Mindanao Region - 3

- 7. A cash prize of P 2,000.00 each, plaques and medallions will be awarded to the Regional winners. The Local Councils and the Schools represented by the Regional winners will be given Plaques of Recognition. The National winners of The Outstanding Boy Scouts of the Philippines for 1998 will receive trophies, medals and cash prize of P 5,000.00 each.
- 8. The criteria for the selection are as follows:

A. PERFORMANCE (80%)

1. Community Service (40%) This refers to leadership and involvement in projects where the beneficiary is the community. The community may be his neighborhood, his municipality, city/province or the region nation. These may be tree growing, literacy program, emergency service, better nutrition civic duty awareness campaign, environmental protection consciousness campaign, sanitation and hygiene drive, river or canal dredging, town fiestal leadership, etc.

Leadership in such activities carry more weight than just simple participation. Awards or recognitions received for such involvement will likewise be given credit.

- Scholastic (20%) This refers to any group/organization or activity/project led or participated
 in by the nominee whether connected with the school or not, as long as it has some relation to
 academic performance. Leadership carries more weight than just membership. Honors and
 recognitions received will likewise be credited.
- Scouting Advancement (20%) Scout must have reached at least the Outdoorsman rank or equivalent, in order to be given credit in this category.

B. CHARACTER (10%)

This refers to his character, spiritual development and bearing. Certification of whether the Scout is living up to the Scout Oath and Law and the Senior Scout Code must be submitted together with a certification from his Religious Leader that he is faithful in the observance of his religious obligations.

C. INTERVIEW (10%)

- 1. Communication Skills (6%) This refers to the ability to express himself in a clear, understandable manner. Convincing power will be given more credit than just ability to express oneself.
- 2 Personality (4%) This refers to his general appearance, grooming, bearing/posture, courtesy in manner and observance of proper decorum.
- Rating Sheets of the Selection Committees in the Local/Region levels must be submitted together with the entry forms of the winners to the National Office, BSP, Manila.
- 10. The following is the timetable for the selection of The Outstanding Boy Scouts for 1998, to wit:

August 25, 1998 — Deadline for submission of entries for Local Council selection

September 1, 1998 - Local Council level selection and interview

September 8, 1998 - Deadline for submission of documents of Local Council winners to the Regional selection

September 15, 1998 - Regional level selection and interview

September 28, 1998 - Deadline for submission of documents of Regional winners to BSP National

Office

October 5-9, 1998 - National level review of Finalists' documents

October 19, 1998 - Arrival of TOBS Finalists

October 20-21, 1998 - Interview of the TOBS Finalists by the National Board of Judges

October 22, 1998 - Tour

October 23, 1998 - Awarding Ceremonies

- 11. The Chairman and the members of the Selection Committee at Local Council/Regional levels are enjoined to be thorough and careful in the selection of candidates in accordance with the stated criteria. Their recommendations, as well as the decision of the National Board of Judges will be final.
- 12. Transportation expenses of the twenty-six (26) finalists to and from Manila and board and lodging while in Manila will be provided.
- 13. The altached Entry Form will be accomplished by the Nominee and must be endorsed by his Troop-Leader and the Institutional head and certified by the parents and the Council Scout Executive
