21st ANNUAL NATIONAL CMLI SUMMER CONFERENCE AND WORKCAMP

1. The Children's Museum and Library, Inc. (CMLI), announces the conduct of its 21st CMLI Annual National Summer Conference and Workcamp of the Junior Members and Teacher-Advisers at Tabaco National High School, Tabaco, Albay from April 24 to May 02, 1999.
2. The convention will resolve on the theme "Filipino Values as Instruments of the Youth as they Confront the Challenges of the New Millenium." This 8-day activity aims to increase the awareness of the youth on certain socioeconomic developments in their communities and in other places.
3. Participants to this Conference must be bonafide and outstanding high school students from both public and private schools nationwide. He/She must satisfy at least one of the following requirements: a member of the honor roll, an officer of the school council, an editor of the school paper or head of any school or community-based organization.
4. A Conference fee of Three Thousand One Hundred Pesos (P3,100.00) will be charged each student-participant and each teacher-adviser to cover expenses for board and lodging, Conference materials and other training expenses. Attendance of participants from public schools may be allowed on official time only. Those coming from private schools shall make arrangements with their respective schools.
5. Schedule of activities and Conference guidelines are inclosed. Those interested must make their reservations on or before April 2, 1999 at the CMLI Secretariat, 23 Maaralin St. corner Masikap Extension, Central District, Diliman, Quezon City with Telefax Number 435-00-08.

## "MAYITATANG VAHITES AS INSTRUMENTS OF THE YOUTH AS THEY CONFRONT THE CHALLENGES OF THE NEW MILLENIUM"

### GUIDELINES

**SUBMITTANCE:** The conference is open to students of public and private, elementary (grades 5 and 6) and secondary schools nationwide. Schools are advised to send their top students, student leaders and active members in the student council, school paper and other school organizations. Aside from the leadership and academic qualifications, each student delegate must be of good moral character and must be physically fit to attend the workcamp and other strenuous activities. Each delegation should have a teacher adviser/s.

**CONFERENCE FEE:** The conference fee is THREE THOUSAND ONE HUNDRED PESOS (P3,100.00) per delegate inclusive board and lodging, conference materials, tour expenses and other training expenses. Transportation expenses from point of origin to Tabaco, Albay and back is NOT included.

**ATTIRE:** Delegates are required to wear formal attire during the opening and closing ceremonies. Will be having also the Santacruzian Parade, so we are advising the delegates to bring their necessary attire for this occasion. Since outdoor and aqua sports activities will be held, appropriate attire is also advised. Please bring sufficient casual and working clothes. For those who will swim, please bring appropriate (decent) swimming attire.

**ACCOMMODATIONS FOR THE CONVENTION:** The delegates shall be staying at Tabaco National High School. The conference fee is inclusive of board and lodging. The food to be served will consist of breakfast, lunch, snacks in the afternoon, and supper. Packed food shall be provided for delegates during activities outside the convention site. First aid stations are located inside the convention site to assure the safety of delegates.

**TALENT VARIETY SHOW:** Delegations who are interested to join

the Talent Variety Show (TVS) should have a prepared individual or group presentation before hand. The CMLI JC-NES reserves the right to screen performers before the actual presentation. Individual performers are given an allotted time of five to ten (8-10) minutes while group performers will be given an allotted time of ten to fifteen (10-15) minutes. They are required to bring their own costumes and props. Although, sound systems will be provided by the CMLI.

**CONTESTS:** The convention shall have the following contests: extemporaneous public speaking contest, timpalak dagliang talumpatian, on the spot essay writing contest, timpalak dagliang sanaysay, poem writing and delivery making contest (English/Filipino) and on-the-spot painting contest. Only one student per delegation is allowed to participate in each contest. Contestant for the painting should bring his or her own coloring medium. The Project Feasibility Study (PFS) and proposal making contest is a competition per school delegation.

**ADDITIONAL PROVISIONS:** It is suggested that the following provisions be brought; flashlights, medicine, mosquito repellants, matches/lighters, toiletries, sun blocks and extra snacks. Delegates are required to bring their own sleeping bags and/or tents if they wish.

**RESERVATIONS:** For those who would like to experience a once in a lifetime summer this coming vacation, reservations are now open. Send the enclosed reply format at a suitable time. ## LIST OF ACTIVITIES

### EXECUTIVE TRAINING SEMINARS (ETS):

The ETS is one of the main features of this conference. This covers leadership training seminars, management by objective (MBO), key result area (KRA), stress and conflict management and project feasibility study (PFS) or proposal making. The seminar shall also include IRIS and Consensus Building. Each school delegation shall design and defend their PFS, which shall serve as basis for implementation in its school or community.

### COMMISSION DISCUSSIONS:

Delegates are grouped into different commissions to engage in group discussions and group dynamic sessions. Various topics related to the theme and the symposium will be discussed to enable the students from different schools and regions to learn from one another and build camaraderie.

### CONTEST:

During the conference, CMI endeavors to encourage individual excellence and discover the potentials of the youth by holding various competitions. Such activities provide gifted delegates a venue for self-expression, allowing their energies to productively ends. This year's contests includes extemporaneous public speaking contest, timpalak dagilang talumpatian, essay writing contest, timpalak dagilang sanaysay, poem writing and delivery contest (English/Filipino) and on the spot poster making contest. There shall also be contests by commissions, which will be discussed by the facilitators during the conference proper. The Project Feasibility Study (PFS) and proposal making contest and defense is one of the highlights of this conference. Each school delegation is encouraged to join and create their own community and school based management programs.

### TALENT VARIETY SHOW (TVS):

The talent variety show participated by various school celebrates the diversity and richness of Filipino culture. Schools who wishes to join the contest must prepare before hand any dance, song, poetry, theater, or musical number to be presented during the activity proper.

### HIKING AND CAMPING:

During the conference, delegates will move to the hiking grounds. Activities during the camping will include community development (tree planting) by commissions and campfire for the delegates to have fun and worthwhile experience. In response to nature's call, there will be a nature walk and hiking.

### SYMPOSIUM:

Part of these weeklong activities is the symposium, which will focus on the theme "VALUING AS INSTRUMENTS OF THE YOUTH AS THEY CONFRONT THE CHALLENGES OF THE NEW MILLENNIUM". Prominent national figures and experts on the subject shall speak on issues relevant to the convention theme. Delegates are given a chance to interact with their guests through an open forum.

### CITY TOUR:

A guided tour shall enable delegates and participants to visit Albay's historical, cultural, religious and natural attractions. It shall enable them to get acquainted with the townfolk of Albay. This will give all the participants the chance to discover the extrinsic feature of the province of Albay.

### WORKSHOPS:

Several workshops shall be staged featuring renowned speakers on the topics ranging from the Arts to Community Development. Workshops for this year will include mountaineering and rappelling.

### OTHER ACTIVITIES:

Other activities include community immersion and development, foster parents, cook-out, survival game, swimming, aqua sportfest and socials. The community immersion and development gives the participants an experience of engaging in small depressed community like helping them to make their barangay clean and green and outreach activities. The aquafest and the survival game stresses the friendly competition, teamwork, physical fitness, and good clean fun. Delegates, competing by commissions, take part in game and athletic events and they are able to show their skills and sportsmanship in Filipino games. Swimming and social activities are held to foster the value of camaraderie.
